***A Day in the Life of Jesus***

Luke 8:22-56

On one particular day in Jesus' life, He initially encountered a dangerous storm on the Sea of Galilee that absolutely terrified His disciples. They cried out, "Master, Master, we are perishing" (Luke 8:24). Jesus would soon rebuke them for their lack of faith, but before rebuking them, He rebuked the violent wind and waves. Suddenly, everything fell silent and still. As a result, fear overwhelmed His disciples for a different reason: they couldn't figure out someone who had power over the elements. "Who then is this," they said, "that he commands even winds and water, and they obey him?" (Luke 8:25).

After arriving on the other side of the Sea of Galilee, Jesus stepped onshore and a demon-possessed man charged at Him (Luke 8:26-28). Jesus was not repulsed by his appearance or reputation. Most people were repulsed by him. He wore no clothes. He lived among the tombs, and He was able to break the chains that were frequently used to subdue him. Jesus commanded the demons to come out of him. Legion, the name of the many demons inhabiting the man, was cast into a herd of nearby pigs, which subsequently rushed down a steep bank and drowned in the lake (Luke 8:30-33). What happened to the pigs served as evidence that the man had indeed been possessed by a powerful force of demons—a force that was obviously not as powerful as Jesus. Like the disciples earlier, the townspeople became afraid of Jesus when they saw the once-crazy man clothed and in his right mind (Luke 8:35-37).

Upon returning to His usual area of activity, the crowds couldn't wait to get at Jesus. An upstanding synagogue ruler named Jairus accosted Him. He threw himself at Jesus, begging Him to heal his twelve-year old daughter who was dying. She was his only child. Jesus had already had a full day, but He wasn't done yet. Jesus decided to go with Jairus (Luke 8:40-42a). Nevertheless, as the crowd pressed around Jesus, a desperate and diseased woman managed to squeeze through the throng and touch the edge of Jesus' cloak. When she touched it, her twelve years of bleeding immediately stopped (Luke 8:42b-44). Sensing that power had gone out of him, Jesus asked who touched him. Everyone denied the deed, and Peter said it's impossible to identify the "culprit" in such a crowd (Luke 8:45-46). Just then and with great courage, the healed woman stepped forward and testified to her healing (Luke 8:47). Fearing the worst, she was undoubtedly relieved to hear Jesus say, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace" (Luke 8:48).

So far in this one day, Jesus had saved people from three seemingly impossible conditions: a dangerous storm, demons, and disease. The fourth—death—awaited Him at Jairus's home. Someone dispatched word that Jairus's daughter had died. The messenger obviously assumed that Jesus could not raise the dead: "Don't trouble the Teacher anymore" (Luke 8:49). But Jesus interrupted and told the father not to be afraid but to have faith and his daughter would live. Upon arriving at Jairus' home, Jesus addressed the mourners who had gathered: "Do not weep, for she is not dead but sleeping" (Luke 8:52). Such a statement is true in that she was about to awake, but the mourners knew that from a human standpoint she is dead. So, they laughed at Jesus. But Jesus took that little girl by the hand and told her to arise. At once, her spirit returned, and she got up, as if she had only been sleeping.

Is Jesus big enough, wise enough, strong enough, and loving enough for you? Doesn't this particular day in the life of Jesus convince you that He is totally, absolutely, and undoubtedly sufficient for you? In one day, Jesus demonstrated His power over a dangerous storm, demons, disease, and even death. A person who has that kind of power demands our fear and our faith. We should stand in awe of Jesus, while entrusting everything to Him.
