A Densely Populated Place

Jesus preached, "For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few" (Matt. 7:14). In other words, few will be in heaven; many will be in hell.

AC/DC glorified hell as well as the journey to hell in their song entitled "Highway to Hell":

Living easy, living free

Season ticket on a one-way ride

Asking nothing, leave me be

Taking everything in my stride

Don't need reason, don't need rhyme

Ain't nothing I would rather do

Going down, party time

My friends are gonna be there, too

So, AC/DC envisions this massive party in hell. They are not alone. Many folks have come to envision hell as an eternal rave for reprobates, rebels, and revelers. Scripture, however, pictures hell as a place of utter isolation and hopelessness where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth in an unquenchable fire and where God cannot be found (Matt. 8:12; 25:30; 25:46; Mark 9:43-50; Luke 16:26; 2 Thess. 1:5-10).

Here's something else to keep in mind: God does not arbitrarily send people to hell. That's the lie of Calvinism. Again, we have a choice in the matter. If we end up in hell, it's not because God arbitrarily decided to send us there; it's because we chose to live a life in rebellion to God. It's because we chose not to reciprocate His love. It's because we refused to respond to His grace with an obedient faith (Eph. 2:8-9; 2 Thess. 1:8).

This whole discussion undergirds the exclusivity of Jesus. Jesus was exclusive: "I am the way, the truth, and the life, and no one comes to the Father but by me" (John 14:6). At this very moment in time, there are literally billions of people on this planet who believe that they can enter into some serene afterlife without Jesus. Jesus says, "No, you can't." Jesus is the only way to heaven. All other ways are detours to doom, and according to Jesus, there will be more people in hell than heaven. Will you be a part of the few or of the many?

Closing it out...

In several discussions that I have had with teenagers over the years, what they've told me is that they feel like God just gives us a list of rules that we have to follow. They don't always understand that God gives guidelines to help us have a more enjoyable existence, not just for eternity, but for our time as sojourners on earth. Moreover, when we compare our "list of rules" with what the Jews under the old covenant had to follow, there is a stark contrast that I believe helps us understand the beauty of the "law of liberty" to which we should submit.

In 1 Thessalonians 4, Paul provides us with a list of things to avoid, but he begins with this clarifying statement in verse 3: "For this is the will of God, your sanctification..." THAT is why God desires that we avoid certain things and take the initiative to do other things. He wants us to be holy. He wants us to enjoy our existence on earth. He ultimately wants us to dwell with Him for eternity. Being a Christian is far more than a list of rules and regulations that we have to follow. It is a way of life that promotes joy, happiness, and peace while on earth and leads us to perfect bliss for all of eternity.

Won't you submit to the beautiful "law of liberty"?
