A Lifestyle

In an article entitled “Not Doing Anything?” Cecil May discusses an oft forgotten aspect to Christianity. A preacher said of his congregation, “These people are good, spiritually-minded people, but except for assembling on Sunday morning, and some coming back for Sunday night and Wednesday night, this church just isn’t doing anything.” To which May replies, “Really? Have any of them put away lying to become truthful with one another? Are they diligent at their jobs, as though they were working for God and not man? Are they compassionate toward the needy and forgiving to those who mistreat them? Are they faithful to their spouses in spite of alluring opportunities to be otherwise? Do they speak a good word for Jesus at school or at the workplace? Do they spend time in private prayer and Bible study?”

Here’s the deal: The Bible says much more about this kind of faithful walk than about the time spent in the assembly or about participation in organized congregational programs (cf. Romans 12-15; Ephesians 4-6; Colossians 3-4). It is absolutely unbiblical to contrast the time spent in the assembly and congregational Bible study with the total hours of the week to show how little time is spent in serving God. While most of us could benefit from more time in public worship and congregational Bible study, activities like the ones May mentioned above are just as important.

Christianity is not comprised of one, two, or three isolated events each week; Christianity is fundamentally a lifestyle. In Romans 12:1, Paul writes: “Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship.” A Christian is to present himself or herself as a “living and holy sacrifice,” not just on Sundays, but the other days of the week as well. Christians need to be just as serious about Monday thru Saturday as they are Sunday. That’s what God requires, and that’s what the world needs to see more than anything.

October 24th – Songs Class! Join us in the auditorium at 6:15 p.m. for a time of learning and edification!

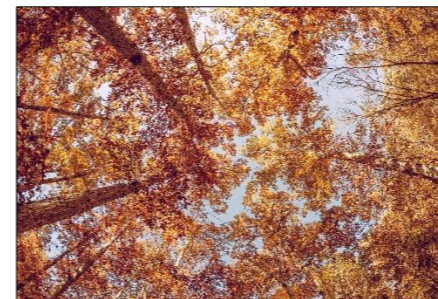
