No Instant Heroes

The story is told of a group of tourists in a picturesque village who walked by an old man sitting beside a fence. In a rather patronizing way, one tourist asked, "Were any great men born in this village?" The old man replied, "Nope, only babies." What a profound answer to a superficial question!

What did Job, Abraham, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, David, Peter, and Paul all have in common? The faith of these spiritual heroes developed over time and through adversity (Heb. 11; Phil. 3:12-15; Jas. 1:2-4). Whether in the world or the kingdom of God, there is no such thing as an instant hero.

When it comes to our spiritual growth, instant maturity is not possible. At our conversion, we began as babies in the faith, and we were expected to mature so as to become adults in the faith (1 Cor. 3:1-3; Heb. 5:12-14). There are no shortcuts. We must all travel the same narrow road of spiritual discipline that our forerunners in the faith did (Matt. 7:13-14). If we withstand the trials and finish the course, we, like them, will receive a crown (Jas. 1:12; 2 Tim. 4:7-8; Rev. 2:10).
