Made to Worship

During our morning worship service this past Sunday, I introduced our theme for 2019: *Made to Worship*. God made us to worship Him. There's a God-shaped hole in all of our hearts that only He can fill (Eccles. 3:11). But in this fallen world, people have been trying to fill that hole in their hearts with someone or something other than God. They've been worshipping the creature rather than the Creator (Rom. 1:25). God, however, desires and deserves true worshipers (John 4:21-24). This year at Pulaski Street is about making sure we are the true worshipers that God seeks.

As I have done the last few years, I will preach on this theme once each month on a Sunday morning. Below is a monthly breakdown of our theme for 2019:

January	Worship is inescapable.
February	Worship is God-centered.
March	Worship is Christ-exalting.
April	Worship is Word-regulated.
May	Worship is wholehearted.
June	Worship is participatory.
July	Worship is communing.
August	Worship is singing.
September	Worship is praying.
October	Worship is giving.
November	Worship is listening.
December	Worship is consecration.

Everyone everywhere worships someone or something. The question is not **if** you are worshipping someone or something but **who or what** are you worshipping. As I said Sunday, worship is inescapable, and it really matters whether or not you are worshipping the One, true, living God (Acts 17:22-31).

My prayer this year is that God will bless us as we carefully consider what it looks like to be a true worshiper of God. If you live in the area and are looking for a church family, don't overlook us. We are confident that our time together this year will prove to be a blessing, and we would love nothing more than for you to join us.
