Idols

On Sunday evenings, we have been discussing the ins and outs of idolatry. Though some may think otherwise, idolatry is not a back-then thing or an over-there thing; it is a right-here-right-now thing. In other words, idolatry is not just an ancient problem or an eastern problem; it's a modern and western problem. God's prohibition against worshiping and serving false gods and idols in Exodus 20:3-4 is just as relevant today as it was in the days of Moses.

The reason this is true is because idolatry, in its essence, it putting someone or something in God's place (cf. Col. 3:5). It's looking to someone or something other than God for purpose, meaning, security, help, or strength in ways that reveal the fact that we are more dependent on the idol or have become more subject to it rather than God. Idolatry often occurs when we take a created thing, even a necessary or good thing, and make it an ultimate thing.

Could it be that you are worshiping and serving an idol? Answering this question involves some difficult soul-searching. It is not necessarily the most fun thing in the world to dig around in our hearts to see if we may be guilty of idolatry, but those of us who are humble enough and brave enough to admit that we may have issues here are in an excellent place. Why? Because you can't dethrone an idol that you have yet to admit has been enthroned in your heart.

In the coming weeks on Sunday evenings (excluding fourth and fifth Sundays as well as those Sundays I am out of town), we are going to discuss various things that have become popular idols in our culture. This will help you and me identify or uncover if we are, in fact, bowing at the foot of some idol rather than God. Below is a tentative schedule of what I hope to cover in the remainder of this series:

- April 21 How to Dethrone an Idol

If you are a Christian, then you should want to make sure that you are not worshiping and serving some idol. Make these meeting times a priority in your spiritual life as you begin the new year.
