Do Your Own Dishes

When you were young, did you have a mother who always did the dishes for you, no matter how busy her schedule or how tiring her day? Some of our mothers probably thought to themselves: “I have so much to do; I can’t believe they don’t realize how this affects my day. Do they think there are dish fairies that come along and clean all this up?”

We usually don’t make a conscious decision to expect others to clean up our messes, but it becomes a habit for far too many people. Wise parents eventually teach their children how to take responsibility and do their own dishes. Unfortunately, there are a great many people, even well into adulthood, that are still refusing to take responsibility for their lives.

It is our spiritual responsibility before God to clean up our own dishes, so to speak. God doesn’t want us piling up all of our dirty dishes in other people’s sinks for them to clean. Jesus gave us a timeless axiom about responsibility in a passage about finances: “He who is faithful in a very little thing is faithful in much; and he who is unrighteous in a very little thing is unrighteous in much” (Luke 16:10). The point is that personal responsibility extends to even the smallest details. Until people learn to own up to their obligations and responsibilities in seemingly small matters, they won’t be faithful in the larger issues of the kingdom of God.

This whole matter obviously has profound implications for salvation and eternity. People who are unable to take responsibility for their messes will never arrive at a place where they can accept Jesus as their Savior. If you can’t admit you are guilty of sin, then you will never admit your need for a Savior.
