## A Story & the Story

In February 1941, Maximilian Kolbe was arrested by the Gestapo and sent to Auschwitz. He was a Polish Monk who founded a Franciscan order near Warsaw called the Knights of the Immaculate.

Eventually he was assigned to Barracks 14 where he continued to minister to his fellow prisoners. One night a man escaped from Barracks 14. The next morning there was tension as the ranks of phantom-thin prisoners lined up for roll call in the square. Afterwards, Commandant Fritsch ordered the dismissal of all but Barracks 14, whose occupants were forced to stand still in the hot sun all day long. By evening the commandant would make a lesson out of the fate of this miserable barracks. "The fugitive has not been found. Ten of you will die for him in the starvation bunker!" he screamed. After the ten were chosen, a cry rang out from one of the men chosen, a Polish Sergeant named Franciszek Gajowniczek: "My poor children! My wife! What will they do?"

Suddenly there was commotion in the ranks. A prisoner had broken out of ranks and volunteered to take this crying man's place. It was Kolbe. The frail priest spoke softly, even calmly, saying, "I would like to take his place, because he has a wife and children." The commandant stood silent for a moment in disbelief, and then surprisingly, he allowed the sergeant to go back to his place in the ranks and Kolbe took his place in the starvation bunker.

Gajowniczek survived Auschwitz and for 53 years—until his death at age 95—he joyously told everyone about the man who had died in his place. In fact, during a television interview in the mid-90s, Gajowniczek took the camera crew to a garden behind his house. In the middle of the garden was a tombstone with Kolbe's name on it along with the inscription: "The man who died in my place."

If you can understand and appreciate this story about Kolbe and Gajowniczek, then you can understand the Gospel. A story often helps to tell the story, and this is one of them. Jesus suffered and died for you. Doesn't Jesus deserve your devotion? Shouldn't you be eternally grateful? Shouldn't you joyously tell everyone about the One who died in your place?
