**The Benefits of Christian Camp**

This past weekend I had the privilege and honor to deliver the keynote address at the first annual benefit dinner for Weeki Wachee Christian Camp in Weeki Wachee, FL. Toward the end of my speech, I shared four benefits of Christian camp. If your child(ren) haven't ever been to a Christian camp, here's some reasons to send them.

Christian camp *creates smiles and laughs*, and we should not downplay that. Some of the biggest belly laughs I've ever had occurred at camp. Christians can have fun, too. The games, activities, and personalities make a fertile ground for enjoyment. Speaking of personalities, I remember this one red-headed kid that did not want to be called by his real name. I can't even tell you what his real name was. We were only to refer to him as "Shadow." In his mind, he was an otherworldly ninja who could virtually disappear in front of your eyes.

Christian camp *contrasts with the familiar*. I love the "awayness" of camp, which is so vital for old and young alike. It takes people away from the noise, demands, routines, and pressures of daily life. It removes them from the constant onslaught of the world's influence through various channels. Kids are afforded an opportunity to fast from technology, opening their eyes to a world beyond their screens and positioning them to be more receptive to the messages they will hear during the week. After all, they have a much easier time focusing on spiritual things when they are not distracted by texting their friends, playing the latest addictive game, or watching their favorite show.

Christian camp *fosters impactful relationships*. Perhaps the most impactful relationship that is forged at camp occurs between the cabin counselor and his/her campers. Back in the 90s, I got pretty close to idolizing my cabin counselors at Whispering Pines Christian Camp in Gallatin, TN. They couldn't have been cooler. They made me laugh, and they mentored me. I loved them. Because of the confined territory of camp and the close living quarters, a cabin counselor will spend more time—both quantity and quality—with a given child than that child's own parents will spend with that child over a multiple-month span. Beyond the counselor-camper relationship, there are the friendships between counselors or between campers that are cultivated that could potentially last a lifetime.

Christian camp *forms faith*. Have any of you ever heard of a summer camp called "Camp Quest"? Camp Quest started 20 years ago and has grown to 14 locations in the United States. It's a camp for atheists, agnostics, humanists, and freethinkers. The camp's tagline is "Summer camp beyond belief!" Campers participate in all kinds of traditional camp activities, e.g., archery, canoeing, climbing, crafts, horseback riding, and swimming, along with an important core of "freethought" activities in line with the camp's secular mission.

One of the most loved freethought activities is called the "Invisible Unicorn Challenge." The children are told that there are two invisible unicorns that live at Camp Quest, but they cannot be seen, heard, tasted, smelled, or touched. They cannot escape from camp, and they don't eat anything. The only proof of their existence is contained in an ancient book handed down over countless generations. The challenge is to *disprove* their existence. Now, it doesn't take a rocket scientist to figure out that these kids are supposed to see that the idea of God is just like these invisible unicorns.

Let me ask you. Do you think that those who go to Camp Quest have fun, smile, and laugh? Yep. Do you think that those who go to Camp Quest are able to unplug and take a break from the familiar? Yep. Do you think that those who go to Camp Quest forge impactful, influential relationships? Yep. You see, what ultimately separates a Christian camp from Camp Quest is what the teachers and counselors are trying to instill in the hearts and minds of the campers.

A week at a Christian camp with qualified teachers and Christ-like counselors is so effective at helping our children know, appreciate, and love Christ. In my humble opinion, parents need to set aside at least one week every summer for their child(ren) to attend a Christian camp.
