Greed

Many have come to view greed as the sin most characteristic of modern America. We face distinctive and powerful temptations with respect to materialism. We are not only the wealthiest society in human history, but we have also chosen to base our economic life on free market capitalism, an economic theory that sees individual self-interest as a powerful force for good. Wealth itself is not sinful, but it poses spiritual dangers that few of the wealthy overcome (Matt. 19:23-26). Similarly, economic freedom and competition are not sinful, but our system easily permits and even glorifies successful selfishness.

Nevertheless, greed is not a distinctively modern or American evil, but a spiritual illness that has plagued human beings throughout history. Writing about 400 A.D., John Chrysostom describes greed as a kind of insane rage that “has laid waste the world.” He compares it to a fire burning equally out of control in the hearts of kings and of the poor. Greed knows no economic boundaries. Chrysostom also claims that everyone spoke against it, but no one changed. From his day to ours, this is the disturbing reality of greed, a sin widely recognized, widely condemned, and widely embraced as though it had not been recognized or condemned.

Greed is a seriously dangerous sin of the heart (2 Pet. 2:14; 1 Cor. 6:9-10; 1 Tim. 6:9-10), and what makes it all the more serious and all the more dangerous is that greed is so difficult to see in our own lives. I can see greed in you, and you can see greed in me, but we often fail to see greed in ourselves. Because greed is so easy to hide from ourselves, I’ve included below a list of statements about greedy people that will help you to determine whether or not greed is a heart disease with which you should be diagnosed:

- Greedy people talk a lot and worry a lot about money.
- Greedy people are not cheerful givers.
- Greedy people are reluctant to share.
- Greedy people ask questions intended to make them look like careful stewards, when, in fact, they’re looking for an excuse not to give.
- Greedy people quibble over insignificant sums of money.
- Greedy people won’t let you forget what they’ve done for you.
- Greedy people always have strings attached to their gifts.
- Greedy people are reluctant to express gratitude.
- Greedy people aren’t content with what they have. They have to have what they want, and they don’t want what they have.
- Greedy people attempt to control people with their money.

If this list just convinced you that you have a problem with greed, all is not lost. In next week’s article, we’ll discuss what a person must do in order to get rid of greed. In the meantime, you’re going to need to pray not only for God’s forgiveness, but also for God’s help. Greed isn’t a financial issue; it’s a spiritual issue.

Closing it out...

Have you ever written down a prayer? I'm sure that many of you have. One of the things that I encourage many of our young men to do if they are leading a prayer in worship and don't have much experience with it is to write it down. Nerves can get to any of us, but especially when we are doing something that we have never done, and we're doing it in front of a big crowd! Writing down our prayers for this purpose allows us to think through what we want to say ahead of time, get familiar with it, and then have it with us should nerves get the best of us in the heat of the moment.

In my opinion, writing down prayers in general is a good practice. In fact, Scripture abounds with actual worded prayers. Many of these are found in the Book of Psalms, and a close examination of them can prove quite helpful! Sometimes we get into a rut and aren't putting forth daily effort to draw near to God. When we get to that point, it can be difficult to begin seeking Him effectively again. At these times, seeing the words of others, such as many of the Psalms of David, can help us see how we should pray and for what we should pray.

So, I encourage you to write down your prayers! After you have done so for a few weeks, look back over them, and it may surprise you how they have been answered!
