**The Inerrancy of the Bible**

All Christians believe that the Bible was breathed out by God (2 Tim. 3:16-17), but not all professing Christians agree that inspiration necessarily entails inerrancy. Some argue that the Bible is true or without error in those areas related to faith, salvation, and ethics, but not in certain scientific, historical, and geographical details. Those in this camp would say that the Bible is *infallible*. Others argue that the Bible is true, despite whether we are talking about doctrinal, scientific, historical, or geographical data. Those in this camp would say that the Bible is *inerrant*. Until the early 60s, these two words were used interchangeably, but in recent years, at least in the US, the word *infallible* is used by Bible scholars to denote "limited inerrancy" rather than "total inerrancy." Below are three reasons that I believe we should view the Bible as inerrant rather than just infallible.

**The Character of God.** In Romans 3:4, the apostle Paul writes, "Let God be true though every one were a liar, as it is written, 'That you may be justified by your words, and prevail when you are judged'" (Rom. 3:4). "Justified" means to be declared righteous; thus, Paul is saying that whenever God speaks He will be proved right, and His words will be found true. In Titus 1:1-2, Paul introduces himself in the following way: "Paul, a servant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ, for the sake of the faith of God's elect and their knowledge of the truth, which accords with godliness, in hope of eternal life, which God, who never lies, promised before the ages began. . . ." God doesn't sometimes lie; He never lies. Similarly, in Hebrews 6:17-18, we read, "So when God desired to show more convincingly to the heirs of the promise the unchangeable character of his purpose, he guaranteed it with an oath, so that by two unchangeable things, in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled for refuge might have strong encouragement to hold fast to the hope set before us." Here the Hebrews writer says not merely that God does not lie, but that it is not possible for Him to lie. Although the immediate reference is only to oaths and promises, if it is impossible for God to lie in these utterances, then certainly it is impossible for Him ever to lie. So, if God cannot lie, and if the Bible is the Word of God, then the Bible cannot lie. So, the character of God undergirds my view that the Bible is inerrant.

**The Omniscience of God.** In Psalm 147:5, the Psalmist writes, "Great is our Lord, and abundant in power, his understanding is beyond measure." In 1 John 3:20, the apostle John affirms that God "knows everything." The Bible makes it clear that God is omniscient (Ps. 139:1-6). So, if an omniscient God stands behind every word of Scripture, I do not see how anyone can affirm that the Bible is simply infallible as opposed to inerrant. To say the Bible is infallible suggests that the God who stands behind the Bible is lacking in knowledge, or correct knowledge, in certain areas. However, the God of the Bible is the God who "knows everything." If God knows everything, then it is hard for me to comprehend or accept the idea that God would choose to breathe out words and concepts that are foreign to reality, despite what the subject under consideration may be.

**The Claims of Jesus.** In John 10:35, Jesus specifically affirmed that "Scripture cannot be broken." The Greek word behind "broken" means "to break, loose, destroy, dissolve." That Scripture cannot be broken means that it cannot be destroyed, refuted, found faulty, found untrue, or disproved. Jesus' statement occurs in the context of a dispute with the Jewish leaders concerning His divine nature. In support of His own deity, Jesus quotes a seemingly obscure statement from Psalm 82:6. He then declares that Scripture as such cannot be broken in order to reinforce the truth and authority of this specific text. In other words, the appeal to Scripture is final, since Scripture cannot be broken. If Scripture can be cited—*any* Scripture, then the argument is settled, since Scripture cannot be challenged, disproved, or denied. Jesus' statement is an affirmation about the nature of the written word as a whole.

In John 16:13, Jesus tells His chosen disciples that the "Spirit of Truth," i.e., the Holy Spirit, would guide them "into all the truth." This statement has profound implications for the nature of the New Testament since some of the men listening to Him on this occasion would go on to write what has come to be recognized as Scripture. The phrase "all the truth" is comprehensive. To attempt, as infallibility advocates do, to impose artificial limits on the truth of which Jesus speaks does not take into careful consideration the fact that "all" means "all."

In John 17:17, while Jesus was praying to the Father in the waning days of His life on this earth, He affirmed in no uncertain terms that God's Word is truth. Since God's Word includes all Scripture, it necessarily follows that Scripture (in all its parts) is true.

Inerrancy is important because it is ultimately the keystone of biblical authority. A keystone is the topmost stone in an arch, the one that holds the others in place. If the keystone is removed, the arch collapses. Inerrancy is like a keystone, because without it the whole structure of biblical authority crumbles.
