## The Cross

The things we believe that are of utmost importance we call “crucial,” often not realizing that the word “crucial” is derived from the Latin for “pertaining to the cross.” Surely no other event in human history (outside of the resurrection) has been as *crucial* as the crucifixion of Christ.

Historians tell us that many ancient maps were drawn with Jerusalem as the very center of the world. Though not necessarily true geographically, it is certainly true that the events that transpired long ago in Jerusalem are the spiritual center of the Christian faith.

The excruciating (also from the Latin, “out of the cross”) pain Christ suffered, the separation He experienced from His heavenly Father, the desertion He encountered by those who knew Him best, and the derision He endured from those who knew Him least should move us internally and externally. It doesn’t matter whether a cross adorns one’s neck, but it does matter whether the cross resides in one’s heart.

The apostle Paul said that the cross had the greatest impact on his life: “But far be it from me to boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world” (Gal. 6:14). Paul personally identified with the cross: “I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. . .” (Gal. 2:20a). Paul kept the cross at the center of his preaching. He told the Christians at Corinth: “For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified” (1 Cor. 2:2).

Like Paul, those of us who are members of Christ’s church should recognize the cross as the crux of our faith. As such, the cross should be central to our character, and it should be at the center of our call to others.
