During our morning worship this past Sunday, I introduced our theme for 2020: *Sent*. Christ's church is not only a gathered community; she is also a sent community. Yes, the church is sometimes a gathered community for the purpose of worship, instruction, and encouragement, but she is also what the reformer Philip Melancthon paradoxically called the "community of the dispersed." The church is called to be salt, light, and leaven in the world (Matt. 5:13-16; 13:13).

Unlike the last four years, I will preach on this theme bi-monthly rather than monthly. Below is a bi-monthly breakdown of our theme for 2020:

March	Sent to Shine
May	Sent to Serve
July	Sent to Share
September	Sent to Suffer
November	Sent to Save

It's one thing to gather with those who have been found; it's another thing to go to those who are lost. It's one thing to love those you know; it's another thing to love those you don't know. It's one thing to speak about Jesus in the assembly; it's another thing to speak a good word for Jesus in the world. It's one thing to keep the saved saved; it's another thing to save the unsaved.

We have been sent to make both a global and a local impact. We have been sent to the "nones" (Eph. 2:12b) and the "wanderers" (2 Tim. 4:1-4; Jas. 5:19-20). We have been sent to fulfill both the Great Commandment (Matt. 22:34-40) and the Great Commission (Matt. 28:18-20). This year we will emphasize that God's people are, indeed, a sent people, and my prayer is that we will all go and not stay.
