One Way to Measure Love

One way to measure the power, the depth, and the genuineness of a person's love is to observe to what degree that person is willing to be inconvenienced by another. How much inconvenience are they willing to voluntarily endure? How much are they willing to sacrifice for the one that they love?

Since coming here to Pulaski Street about five years ago, I've seen some amazing examples of such love. I think back to when Eric and Mandy McClaren had to wait so long to take their baby home, yet they stayed close to Grayson, despite the difficulties and inconveniences such a situation created. I think of all those children and their spouses who have had to take on the role of a caretaker for an aging parent. It's not easy. It comes with interruptions and inconveniences, but you do it because of your love for that parent.

Possibly the most extreme example of love that we could imagine is to suppose that the richest person on earth who is living in a nation on earth that enjoys incalculable amounts of wealth, perfect health, and unbelievable peace trades that kind of life for a life in the poorest country on earth, living the rest of his existence in a country ravaged by disease, poverty, and war, voluntarily putting himself in the middle of all that to help the people of that country. That's a love that's beyond what most of us can even fathom.

Now, think about the story of Jesus. The story of Jesus is a story of love that far surpasses the story of that rich man on earth. That story pales in comparison to the story of Jesus. Jesus didn't just move countries on earth. As one old song essentially says, "He came out of the ivory palaces of heaven into a world of woe; only His great eternal love made my Savior go." It's the ultimate love story to think of Jesus, who was in the beginning before the creation, in this loving union with God the Father, who was Himself fully God, and through whom all things were created, entering His own creation, becoming one with His own creation, taking on all of their poverty and their sickness and their troubles, and putting Himself in harm's way for each one of us (2 Cor. 8:9; Phil. 2:5-9). He was willing to be inconvenienced to this extent, because He loved us (1 John 3:16).
