Why Gather with God's Family?

Pulaski Street family, as we eye our return to an in-person assembly on Sunday, June 7, 2020, I want to remind us why gathering with God's family is so important. I would like to think that as we crawl out of this pandemic that we will eventually see more addition than attrition. I would like to think that none of us will ever take our assemblies for granted again. I realize that a discussion of assembling at this point in time is rife with caveats, but I believe it is important for us to consider the weight that Scripture places upon gathering with God's family. Below are five reasons why we should cherish the assembly.

It is a sign of faithfulness to God. A consideration of certain passages in Acts (20:6-7; 21:14; 28:14) and 1 Corinthians (11:17-34; 14:23; 16:1-2) yields the conclusion that, at the very least, first-century Christians in various localities assembled every first day of the week. When we gather with our brothers and sisters in Christ, such serves as an indication that we are devoted to God, Jesus Christ, and those whom Christ has redeemed. With this statement, however, some clarifications are in order. On the one hand, our faithfulness to God should never be measured *only* by whether we gather with God's family in a certain locality on the first day of the week. Indeed, our lives outside of the gathering should reflect our lives inside of the gathering. On the other hand, assembling with the brethren should never be dismissed as an unnecessary or optional element in our spiritual lives. This viewpoint, which we responded to in last week's article, is becoming more and more popular today. In God's estimation, you cannot have Jesus without the church. The bridegroom comes with the bride, and vice versa (cf. Eph. 5:25-30). We should add here that God understands if we are prevented from assembling in person because of health problems, work demands, or pandemic precautions.

It is vital to one's spiritual fellowship with God and other members of God's family. Something deeply spiritual transpires when we gather as God's family (1 Cor. 10:16-17). Gathering with God's family provides a crucial context not only for offering God worship, praising Him, and communing with Him but also for fellowshiping and communing with our brothers and sisters in Christ (Acts 2:42-47).

It supplies an invaluable context for hearing what the world will never tell you. When we gather as God's family, the communication of certain concepts and ideas takes place in various ways (Eph. 5:19-20; Col. 3:16; 1 Tim. 4:13), and the content of this communication should be saturated with God's Word (2 Tim. 4:1-4). Our world is what we might call a "myth factory." The world has a host of alluring myths and lies that it is constantly communicating to people through various mediums. If all we ever listen to is what the world wants to tell us, then we are in trouble. In an interview I did with William Woodson years ago for one of my classes at FHU, I remember him passing along this word of advice: "It is never good to listen to just one side of the phone conversation." When we gather as God's family, we are afforded an opportunity to listen to the other side of the phone conversation, so to speak, and to learn what God, not the world, regards as important and worthy of our time and efforts.

It is an indispensable means of growth and encouragement. Ephesians 4:11-16 focuses on the growth of the body. A body is not going to grow if it isn't nurtured, and there will be no nurturing if the members of the body fail to assemble. Notice the emphasis in Hebrew 10:24-25, "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." This passage is more about assembling to encourage than encouraging to assemble. How could early Christians encourage and strengthen one another, except by being together? Edifying, exhorting, and encouraging are essential purposes of the assembly (1 Cor. 14:1-33, see especially vv. 3-5, 12, 17, 26, 31).

It provides a foretaste of heaven. Among the things that Revelation 4:8-11 and 5:6-14 teach us is that we are going to do some worshiping in heaven. We are not only going to sing words of praise to God, but unlike here, we will "see" (if I may use that word) God. We will be in the unadulterated presence of God (Rev. 21:3), worshiping side-by-side with all our brothers and sisters in Christ. Our gatherings on this side of eternity are but a foreshadowing of something deeper and more glorious than we can even begin to imagine.

Our main target group for this endeavor are those in our church family and other sister congregations who do not have access to the internet, Facebook, etc. Please share this information with anyone you might know who could benefit from it.

- Deposit your contribution in a basket, and throw away your PCK(s) as you leave through the foyer.
