Christians and the Political Panic

Fearmongering is a popular political strategy, especially in presidential election years. In our two-party system, each side paints a bleak or frightening picture of what the country will look like if the other side wins the election. Some of the more radical folks associated with each side will describe in detail some scary scenario that they claim will become reality if this or that side is victorious. Such fear-inducing rhetoric has become the norm every four years in America, and millions of Americans, including some Christians, get swept up in the political panic.

After addressing the coming Assyrian invasion of both Israel (northern kingdom) and Judah (southern kingdom), the prophet Isaiah reports the following: "For the LORD spoke thus to me with his strong hand upon me, and warned me not to walk in the way of this people, saying: 'Do not call conspiracy all that this people calls conspiracy, and do not fear what they fear, nor be in dread. But the LORD of hosts, him you shall honor as holy. Let him be your fear, and let him be your dread'" (8:11-12). Whatever the specific applications these words may have had for Isaiah in his day, there is a principle here that all Christians need to take to heart: *In fearing or revering the Lord, we don't have to fear anyone or anything else.*

As representatives of King Jesus and citizens of heaven, Christians should have a different disposition than those whose citizenship is exclusively terrestrial. Fearmongering usually makes liberal use of exaggeration in order to manipulate the populace, but even if the worst-case scenario were a real possibility, those of us who are Christians should not succumb to the gloom and doom. To be lights in this world, we must remain calm when everybody else is panicking. People need to see that our faith and hope are tied to Someone who is eternal, trustworthy, strong, and wise, and not someone or something that is fleeting and fickle.
