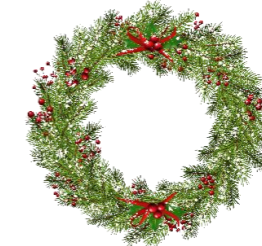

YOUTH NEWS

The last bulletin of 2020. Many (if not all) of us are probably thankful to say that 2020 is coming to a close! If I have seen one post on social media about being ready for this year to be over, I've seen a hundred (or, maybe a thousand)! This year has not been all bad, though. While there have certainly been challenges, I want to write this bulletin article about some of the good things that I have noticed from this year and the positive experiences that I have had.

To begin with, the pandemic has necessitated more time at home. I realize that this one is a double-edged sword, because more time at home isn't a blessing to everyone. That reality saddens me, but for my family, it has been a blessing! We have eaten more meals at the table in 2020 as a family than we have in any other year. We have gone on more adventures in nature, taking walks, playing, hunting, driving while trying to "catch the sunset," and other outdoor activities than we have in the past. We've been able to just sit and talk. The time that we have been together has been a blessing!

Another positive from 2020 has been the technological progress that we have made at church. The list would be very long if I were to try to mention everyone who has invested a huge amount of time and energy into learning how to implement the upgrades that we have installed at Pulaski Street, but I will mention a few. Mark Miller and Ethan Hammond were mainstays around the church building during the process of deciding what equipment was needed and learning how to use it effectively. The many people who run our system on Sundays were required to spend a good deal of time learning the ins and outs of everything so that broadcasts could go as smoothly as they do. And, of course, Jacob Evans has been patient and diligent in figuring out how to reach all of us on a regular, consistent basis. Despite many difficulties and increased work during the last nine months, Jacob has shown what it means to be a minister of a local congregation, perhaps even more than prior to the pandemic. I am very thankful for the many people who have invested so much to make what we are doing with our services possible now.

I have seen opportunities for growth among our young people. Obviously, many of us have struggled at various points of our lives since the pandemic struck, and our youth group is no exception. However, so many of them have overcome the challenges beautifully! Some of them have been finding ways to cheer others up, even if they can't do so in person. Some have started doing more in-depth personal Bible study. In making sure that all of the necessary things for our worship services are available, some of our young ladies have helped package up the personal communion kits and put out masks. Several of our young men have taken leading roles in our worship services in ways that they had not done previously. When I see people like Jayse Hughes reading Scripture during worship for the first time and Caleb Evans helping to run the audio/visual equipment in the booth, as well as so many other young people leading, it brings me joy!

Finally, I have been reminded of how thankful I am for the leadership that our elders provide at Pulaski Street. Even when they don't see eye to eye on every decision that is made, they listen, pray, discuss, and then decide things in a way that humbles me. And then they support one another! Any leadership role in times like these is difficult, yet they have carried it out with grace, understanding, flexibility, and bravery. If you need a role model to look up to, any of those four men would be a good place to start.

There are certainly other positives to be taken from 2020, but there is not enough space to mention them all! Thank you to each one of you for the encouragement that you have given to me and others and your continued commitment to the Lord and to the local church at Pulaski Street. I love you all so much!
