Knowledge Rejects

Part One

God's demand for knowledge should not surprise us. He wants us to know His will through His Word so that we might come to know Him and establish a relationship with Him—a relationship that will carry us through this life and into the next. To the Colossians, Paul writes, "And so, from the day we heard, we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of his will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding, so as to walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him: bearing fruit in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God . . ." (Col. 1:9-10). It is important to note that "knowledge of [God's] will" or "knowledge of God" is more than just the ability to quote Scripture or recite Bible facts; it also involves the willingness and ability to exemplify that knowledge in one's lifestyle.

Unfortunately, when it comes to "knowledge," certain people, even professing Christians, have it all wrong. I have chosen to refer to these people as "knowledge rejects." Below are two kinds of "knowledge rejects" with whom God is displeased and whom God rejects. We'll consider two more in next week's article.

The Ever-Learner. After giving a list of what people will succumb to in "the last days" along with an admonition to avoid those people who practice these things (2 Tim. 3:1-5), Paul tells Timothy that among them will come people who will stealthily invade people's homes (like wolves in sheep's clothing) and capture spiritually "weak women" (literally, "little women") with their false teaching and false practices. These women are described as being laden with sins and led astray by various unspecified passions (2 Tim. 3:6). They were especially vulnerable to these invaders because they were "always learning and never able to arrive at a knowledge of the truth" (2 Tim. 3:7).

Some people, like these women described in 2 Timothy 3:7, don't want to arrive at the truth, for the pursuit of it is seen as an end in and of itself. The pursuit of truth is what they love, not possessing the truth. Their minds have essentially become so fickle and warped that they have become incapable of attaining the knowledge of the truth, the very knowledge that God desires all people to acquire in order to be saved (1 Tim. 2:4). These folks are like the Athenians who liked to "spend their time in nothing except telling or hearing something new" (Acts 17:21). The quest is for sensational, not serious, information. An *Ever-Learner* is frustrating. It is impossible to please God without conviction about who He is, what He's done, and what He desires.

The In-the-Dark Enthusiast. Zeal and knowledge go together like a computer mouse and a cursor. Zeal without knowledge is like a ship without a rudder or like a runaway horse. The Jews of Jesus' day were zealous for God, but they were without a knowledge of the truth; thus, they killed the Son of God (Acts 3:14-17; cf. Rom. 10:2-4). Saul of Tarsus was zealous for God but lacked knowledge, so he persecuted, imprisoned, and murdered Christians (Acts 22:3-5; 26:9-11; 1 Tim. 1:13; Phil. 3:4-6). When Saul's zeal married knowledge, he became known as the apostle Paul, and he was ready to die for Christ (Acts 21:13; Phil. 3:7-11). What was true of the Jews in Jesus' day and of Saul in the days of the early church is also true of many radical Muslims today (cf. John 16:1-4). An In-the-Dark Enthusiast is dangerous. The need for true knowledge can scarcely be underestimated. Today, that knowledge can only be found in God's Word (John 17:17).
