A Perilous Precipice

In Into Thin Air, John Krakauer tells of his harrowing experience climbing Mt. Everest. On May 10, 1996, Krakauer made it to the top. He paused only for a few minutes before heading down, his muscles exhausted, his limbs frozen, and his brain deprived of oxygen. As he descended, some clouds drifted up and enveloped him. Soon, thunder, lightning, and a snowstorm threatened to disorient him, but he was close enough to one of the base camps to get to the sheltering tents before the full force of the storm hit.

A group of four climbers arrived at the summit shortly before Jon, but they stayed longer than he did. They did not have time to get to the camp before darkness. The storm caused them to lose their way. Exhausted and lost, they decided to hunker down and wait out the night. When they awoke in the morning, they found they had lain down just one step from the 4,000-foot precipice of the South Wall. They had slept the night on the edge of a cliff in the middle of a snowstorm.

Like that snowstorm on Mt. Everest, our culture can disorient us with the winds of relativism, the icy cold of indifference, and the darkness of unbelief. Many people are teetering on spiritual disaster, and they don't even know it. But there's hope for them. There's a light, and those of us who follow Christ have a responsibility to point people to Christ, who is the light (John 1:4-5; 8:12; 12:46). He reveals our position and points the way to safety.
