When asked what prayer is about, most people respond that prayer is about petitioning God. Praying is, to many people, about petitioning God for the benefit of ourselves or the benefit of others. Many people believe or fall into the trap of thinking that praying is almost exclusively about petitioning God to change or intervene in a certain situation or to get from God what they think they need. To be sure, petitioning God is a biblical, valid, and legitimate reason for engaging in prayer (Matt. 6:11; John 17; Rom. 10:1; Phil. 4:6; Col. 4:12; 1 Tim. 2:1-2). Petitionary or intercessory prayers are found all over the Bible (Gen. 18; Exod. 32; 1 King 17-18; 2 Kings 20; Acts 4). Prayer is about petition; it is about asking God for things or submitting requests, BUT it's about more than that. Consider some other reasons for praying:

- Thanksgiving is the outpouring of gratitude to God because of His grace, mercy, and loving-kindness (Psalm 103; Phil. 4:6).
- James 5:15-16; 1 John 1:9).

Prayer involves drawing near to God so as to cultivate an intimate relationship with God. Prayer is about adoring and praising God and expressing our evaluation of Him. Prayer is also about expressing to God our hopes, dreams, and delights, as well as our fears, doubts, and faults. We lay our souls bare before God and pour out everything to Him that is inside of us. That facilitates intimacy with God. Consequently, it shouldn't be a surprise that the times in our lives that we have felt the closest to God are the times that our prayer life was the strongest.

Furthermore, as we bare our souls before God, it helps us to know ourselves better in that we express all those things that reside deep down inside of us. It provides a perfect context for us to begin to deal with those things that we would probably rather not deal with or have suppressed in our hearts. It forces us to deal with our sin. It puts all of that out into the open and forces us to come to terms with what we find in our heart and in our lives. Why, for instance, do you think Jesus told us to pray for our enemies (Matt. 5:44)? To change our enemies or to change us? Is it not primarily so that we can expose and deal with that resentment, hatred, and anger that resides in our hearts? Prayer is not so much about changing God's will so that our will is done in heaven; prayer is more about our will being changed so that God's will is done on earth. Sometimes our prayers don't change our situation, but they change us, giving us the peace, courage, and strength to accept and do God's will.

Prayer is more than just submitting a work order to God. It's more than just presenting a heaven-to-do list. Just as God is more than a glorified delivery boy, prayer is more than petition. It's about talking to Him about what's inside of us and cultivating an intimate relationship with Him. And as our awareness and appreciation of the other dimensions of prayer grow, so will our motivation to pray.


