Classifying Sin

We should be careful in classifying sin as "big" or "little" or as "black" or "white." There is a danger in trying to classify sin in these ways. As it often the case, there are certain types of misbehavior that we consider especially egregious—truly worthy of the label sin, and other types of misconduct that we tend to overlook. If we are not careful, we can fall into the trap of thinking of certain sins as true sins and label those who commit those "gross" sins as sinners, while thinking of other sins as virtually insignificant and fail to indict those who commit those sins (including ourselves) with sin. At the very least, those sins that fall into the latter category are "respectable sins," or sins that we tolerate for one reason or another in ourselves or in others.

Now, some sins do, in fact, come with more devastating consequences or a darker stigma in this life, but every sin, no matter the nature of it, has the same spiritual effect. Every sin separates us from God (Isa. 59:1-2; Rom. 6:23).

Consider 1 Corinthians 6:9-10. Alongside "adulterers," homosexuals, "thieves," and "drunkards," there are "the greedy" and the "revilers." Paul's warning in this context is the same for all. Each one of these sins can keep a person out of the kingdom of God.

Consider Galatians 5:19-21. Alongside "sexual immorality," "idolatry," "drunkenness," and "orgies," we find sins like "enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, [and] divisions." In view of them all, Paul says that "those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God" (vs. 21).

Consider Romans 1:18-32. Alongside idolaters (vv. 24-25), homosexuals (vv. 26-27), "haters of God," and murderers, we find sins like "covetousness," "envy," gossip, and disobeying parents. A death sentence is attached to one just as it is to the other (vs. 32).

In these lists and others, God makes no distinction between "big" and "little" or between "black" and "white." Every sin, no matter its nature, stigma, or earthly consequences, separates a soul from God. Every sin we commit, no matter its nature, stigma, or earthly consequences, must be acknowledged. Fortunately, the blood of Jesus is powerful enough to cover any sin, no matter the nature, the stigma, or the earthly consequences, but that sin must be acknowledged, confessed, and rejected (1 John 1:5-10).
