The Goal of Spiritual Shepherds

Spiritual shepherds or elders do not serve so that the congregation might serve them. They serve so that the congregation might better serve the Lord. They are trying to move their sheep onto the Lord's agenda, not their own agenda (1 Pet. 5:1-3). In view of this overarching goal, spiritual shepherds will work to accomplish the following things in their ministry.

Giving glory to God. Spiritual shepherds realize that it is possible to fulfill their responsibilities but still dishonor God in the process by neglecting to give him the glory. True spiritual leaders value glorifying God more than they prize personal or organizational success (1 Cor. 10:31; Gal. 1:10; Eph. 1:13-14; 1 Pet. 2:9).

Leading others to spiritual maturity. Like Paul, spiritual shepherds strenuously toil to "present everyone mature in Christ" (Col. 1:28-29). They are charged with helping their local body of Christians "grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ" (Eph. 4:15). An eldership is like the captain of a ship. As the ship approaches its destination, the crew begins its lookout for the first sight of land. The captain, a veteran seaman, has experienced every possible kind of sailing condition. His crew, on the other hand, is much less experienced. He helps them learn to discern if a distant shape is a rock or a whale. He shows them how to scan the horizon and how to recognize when their eyes are playing tricks on them. Eventually the captain no longer needs to be on the deck watching for the land. His crew now knows how to do it.

Equipping others to lead. A common failure among elderships is that they spend little time or effort preparing the church for their departure. This mistake can clearly be seen in the life of Samuel. Samuel was one of the godliest leaders Israel ever had. At the time of his "retirement," no one with whom he had worked could find any fault with him (1 Sam. 12:1-5). Nevertheless, Samuel ultimately failed as a leader in the sense that he did not prepare a successor (1 Sam. 8:1-6). Unless leadership development is intentional within the church, it will not happen. To this end, the spiritual leaders of a given congregation must regularly practice four habits: (1) delegate responsibilities to potential leaders; (2) give would-be leaders freedom to fail; (3) recognize and praise their success; (4) provide them with encouragement and support along the way.

Spiritual shepherds are engaged in a worthy, but weighty, endeavor. After explaining what was expected of elders, the apostle Peter, an elder himself, offers the following encouragement to spiritual shepherds everywhere: "And when the chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory" (1 Pet. 5:4).
