Endurance Exemplified

In 1983, Australia hosted its ultramarathon, a 574-mile foot race from Sydney to Melbourne. This is a race that takes days to run, and professionals from all over the world came to participate. Shortly before the race began, a sixty-one-year-old sheep herder named Cliff Young, wearing overalls and galoshes over his boots, walked up to the registration table and requested a number to enter the race. The people at the registration table thought it was a joke—that somebody was setting them up—so they laughed. But Cliff Young said, "No, I'd really like to run." Well, they still thought it was a joke, but they gave him a number anyway and pinned it on his old overalls. He walked over to the start of the race. All the other professional runners, who were decked out in all their running regalia, looked at him like he was crazy. The crowd snickered. People began to laugh. They laughed even more when the gun went off and the race began. Cliff Young didn't run like all the runners with their sculpted bodies and beautiful strides; he ran with an awkward, goofy-looking shuffle, later referred to as the "Young-Shuffle." All through the crowd people were laughing, and someone eventually called out, "Get that old fool off the track!"

Five days, fourteen hours, and four minutes later, at 1:25 in the morning, Cliff Young shuffled across the finish line of the 574-mile ultramarathon. He had won the race, and he didn't win by a nose, with the guy in second right on his heels. He didn't win by a matter of minutes or even an hour or two. The second-place runner was nine hours and fifty-six minutes behind him. As a matter of fact, Cliff Young had set a new world record for the ultramarathon. It was unbelievable. He became an instant hero in Australia. The press mobbed him, wondering what kind of special running shoes he must have had, and they rummaged through his backpack wondering what he'd survived on—he'd lived primarily on pumpkin seeds and water. Then, it was discovered: Nobody ever told Cliff Young that when you run in the ultramarathon, you run for eighteen hours straight, and then you stop and sleep for three or four hours. No, Cliff Young shuffled his way to victory without ever sleeping. He endured running five days, fourteen hours, and four minutes at the age of sixty-one.

While Cliff Young is a great example of endurance, there is, of course, One who trumps Him—Jesus Christ. In fact, in the context of Hebrews the thought passes from the encouragement of several earthly examples (Hebrews 11) to Jesus as the supreme example who is to be imitated (12:1-3). He is the One to whom we are to look as we are running with endurance the race that is set before us. The Greek verb translated "looking" means "to look away from all other things to look at one." So, the Christian runner must have his "eyes" set on Jesus and nothing else, trusting and following only Him. Why this focus on Jesus? Because He is the author and perfecter of our faith. The word translated "author" or "founder" is rich with meaning and can communicate variously the idea of champion, leader, forerunner, initiator, or pioneer. These various nuances may overlap in this context. Jesus not only accomplished fully what it would take for new covenant faith to become a reality, but He also provided the preeminent example of endurance because He looked beyond immediate, painful circumstances to the reward that was ahead. Jesus finished what he started. If we make an accurate reckoning and maintain our focus on Jesus and what He endured on our behalf, we will not collapse on the track before the race is finished (Heb. 12:3).
