So-called "influencers" abound on TikTok, Instagram, Twitter, and Facebook. They affect the behavior, opinions, and decisions of others, especially in relation to consumer products or services. Christians are called to be "influencers," but instead of peddling some consumer product, they are to promote the Christ and His kingdom.

In His Sermon on the Mount, Jesus transitions from certain attitudes that are characteristic of His followers (Matt. 5:3-12) to their influence as His followers (Matt. 5:13-16). Using imagery that would have resonated with His hearers in the first century, He explained that His disciples are to stay salty and remain radiant in hopes of influencing those around them for good. Below are some practical considerations in being an influencer for Christ.

Assess your attitude. In Philippians 2:14-16, Paul writes, "Do all things without grumbling and disputing, that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, holding fast to the word of life, so that in the day of Christ I may be proud that I did not run in vain or labor in vain." It's hard to shine if all we do is whine. Folks need to see a difference in our disposition, in our outlook, and in our attitudes. Rotten attitudes will obscure our light about as much as anything else.

Ponder before you post. There obviously isn't a verse in the NT that specifically and explicitly addresses a Christian's use of social media, but Paul's words in Colossians 4:5-6 supply us with some much-needed guidance: "Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of time. Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person." Before you post something on some social media outlet, ask yourself these three questions: (1) Is it true? (2) Is it tactful? (3) Is it tasteless?

**Counter the culture.** Walk differently from the world. Take a moment to read Ephesians 5:3-17. Did you notice the contrast between light and darkness? As the light, we are called to live differently from the darkness. Elsewhere, in Romans 13:12, Paul writes, "Let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light." We are not to praise what the darkness praises. We are not to do what the darkness encourages. We are not to prize what the darkness prizes. Our conduct must be discernibly different. We cannot live light-filled lives in our society without standing out. If there is no difference between our behavior and the world's behavior, we aren't shining our lights; we're simply adding to the darkness. An influence, by definition, must be different from that which it influences; thus, we must be different from the world we are called to influence. One person has rightly observed, "Our lifestyle is the most powerful indicator of whether Jesus Christ is real to us and relevant in our daily experiences."

Do good deeds. In Matthew 5:16, Jesus seems to equate letting our light shine with doing good works. As Jesus went about doing good (Acts 10:38), so must we do good deeds. The purpose of letting our light shine through good deeds is not to bring attention to ourselves but to the Father. Intention is key here (cf. Matthew 6:1-18). There is admittedly a fine line between magnifying ourselves and magnifying God, but the latter must be our focus in the good that we do.

We cannot afford to allow our saltiness to lose its flavor (Matt. 5:13; Mark 9:50) or our light to be hidden or extinguished (Matt. 5:15). Above are four effective ways in which we can stay salty and remain radiant. Christ loves the world, and He needs us to help Him win the world.
