How to Respond to an Awesome God

What Job says in Job 42:1-6 furnishes us with a good idea of how you and I should respond to an awe-inspiring God. Two aspects of Job's response were praising God (vv. 1-2) and embracing mystery (vv. 3-4), which we've considered over the last two weeks. In this article, we'll look at one more aspect of how we should respond to an awesome God.

In Job 42:5-6, Job continues his response to God's barrage of unanswerable questions: "My ears had heard of you, but now my eyes have seen you; therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes." Like Job, we should bow down to God.

Job's statement in vs. 6, "I despise myself," is very similar to one of his statements in Job 40:4, which is variously translated "I am vile" (KJV), "I am insignificant" (NASB), "I am unworthy" (NIV), "I am nothing" (NLT), and "I am of small account" (ESV). Job understood that God is God, and he is not. After spending a little time in the presence of God, Job, like Isaiah (Isa. 6:5), came undone. God's holiness highlighted just how far he had fallen. The best Job could do was humble himself and repent.

Arrogance is a cancer that has consumed many of us in the modern West, and we often don't even recognize it. Such arrogance is manifested in various ways to various degrees. Sometimes we manifest our arrogance in our relationship with God, especially when we think that He should answer for Himself on any count. Herein lies one of the most valuable messages in the Book of Job. Job, who is an upright man with loads of integrity, incessantly guestions God about what He has done to him and why He has done it. First-time readers of the Book of Job begin to feel Job's consternation and confusion. Like Job, they want God to show up and defend Himself. Then, God shows up, and they, like Job, realize, "Oh yeah . . . you're God. I almost forgot." We frequently expect that God should play by our rules. We arrogantly think that we might just have a better perspective on things than God does. When certain difficulties or tragedies befall us, we find reasons to mistrust God rather than humble ourselves and recognize His place in the universe.

And don't get me started on how entitled we've become. We may not consciously think, "God, you owe me," but we act like it sometimes. We often act like God should be at our beck and call. God gives us so much, but who says that God must give us any of it? Everything you and I get from God is a gift. We don't get a paycheck from God. We don't earn anything from Him. We should be grateful for everything we receive from Him. A grateful heart resides in the person who recognizes the Source of all his/her blessings and gifts (Jas. 1:17). God is the "blesser"; we are the "blessees." We have got to realize our place. Job did, and we should follow suit. Let's bow down before the Almighty God, not only because of who He is, but also because of what He has given us.
