# The Leader in the Home

In Ephesians 5:22-24, we read: "Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit in everything to their husbands."

I don't have to tell you, but from a 21<sup>st</sup>-century perspective, these are among the most controversial words that Paul ever wrote. It's not uncommon to hear feminist biblical scholars refer to Paul as a male chauvinist, while ardently reminding men that women aren't inferior.

In response, let's first note that it isn't wise to "shoot" (i.e., criticize) the messenger. If a person has a problem with male headship, he or she must ultimately take that up with God, not Paul. There's a strong theological rationale for male headship: (1) the principle of the firstborn (1 Tim. 2:13, "For Adam was formed first, then Eve."; cf. Col. 1:15, 18); (2) the principle of source (1 Cor. 11:8, "For man was not made from woman, but woman from man.; cf. Col. 1:16); (3) the principle of naming (Gen. 2:20-23). Adam didn't just name all the animals; he named Eve. For these reasons and others (cf. 1 Tim. 2:14), the man is the head of the home, and he will be held accountable for the headship and leadership he provides for his family.

Second, Paul isn't thinking in terms of superiority or inferiority. Headship is not so much about power, but about responsibility. It's not about ordering a wife and children around; it's about leading them well, taking responsibility for important decisions that affect the family, providing for them, and protecting them. And among the most important responsibilities that a husband/father has is leading his family spiritually.

Notice what Paul later emphasizes in Ephesians 6:4b. To those of us who are fathers, Paul says that we are to "bring [our children] up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord." There are many things our children need to learn about life, but nothing is more important than learning about spiritual matters: God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, the Bible, the church, salvation, heaven, and hell. As fathers, it is our responsibility to lead our families spiritually. We do that through teaching it and living it. We do that by seizing teachable moments, praying with our families, reading Bible stories to our children, discussing Bible principles with our children as they mature, demonstrating the fruit of the Spirit in our own lives, and worshiping and working with our church family. The home has indispensable work to do in spiritually training children; the church cannot and will not supply all the spiritual training needed.

No father should abdicate his headship role or responsibility in the home. Fathers, don't cop out. Be the leader in the home that God expects you to be.

### Closing it out:

If we can learn from history, the mistakes of society at large, and those around us, we will be more likely to live today as God would have us live.
