# **Reasons for Christ's Preeminence**

In Colossians 1:15, Paul writes the following about Jesus Christ: "He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation." Jesus is preeminent because He is the *revealer*.

J. B. Philips translated "image" as "visible expression," meaning that Jesus brought God into the human sphere of understanding. Jesus Christ manifested God. The terminology is similar to Hebrews 1:3, where the writer stated that Jesus is the "exact representation" of God, and John 1:18, which states that Jesus "has made [God] known" (cf. John 14:9). The point is that in Jesus Christ the invisible God became visible, so to speak. He shared the same substance as God and made God's character known in this earthly sphere of existence. Jesus is God's ultimate self-expression. In his commentary on Colossians, David Garland puts it this way: "As God's representation and representative, Christ brings clarity to our hazy notions of the immortal, invisible God, who lives in unapproachable light" (87).

With the phrase "image of God," we recall that humanity was also made in the "image of God" (Gen. 1:26-27). As such, not only does Jesus show us what God is like, but He also shows us what it means to be humantruly human. He shows us what it looks like to live out God's original intentional for humanity (Col. 3:10). N.T. Wright sums it up: "Paul's way of expressing the doctrine [of incarnation] is to say, poetically, that the man Jesus fulfills the purposes which God had marked out both for himself and for humanity" (Colossians & Philemon 70-71).

The next phrase "the firstborn of all creation" has been the subject of misunderstanding ever since the time of Arius, who argued, in hopes of protecting Christianity from the charge of polytheism, that Jesus was greater than the rest of the creation but lesser than God. But Paul here is not saying something that would contradict other passages of Scripture (cf. John 1:1, 18; 8:58-59; 20:20), even in the context of Colossians (1:19; 2:9). Paul is not arguing that Jesus is the firstborn part of the whole creation, as if Jesus is to be placed within the created world order. Jesus existed before the created world order; He stands outside the created world order. The term "firstborn" distances Jesus from creation rather than subsuming Him under it. Jesus is the firstborn, i.e., the preeminent one, with reference to the creation over which he is prominent. As the NIV says, Jesus is "the firstborn over all creation." The point of the metaphor is to distinguish Him from creation and to convey the idea of His priority in both time and rank. In fact, as we'll see in next week's article, Jesus was personally involved in the creation of the universe.

Many of us have mistakenly assumed that other people aren't grieving something because they don't display it in the same way that we do. That's a mistake. When it comes to grieving any sort of loss, we experience it individually and not in the same way as everyone else.

The Bible, however, tells us about a different kind of grief, and when experienced, it leads to the same result, regardless of the person going through it. "For godly grief produces repentance that leads to salvation without regret . . ." (2 Cor. 7:10).

If we actually do experience this godly grief, the implication is that repentance and salvation will follow. If we don't act on it, following through with repentance, then it was worldly grief. When we feel the need to make things right, we would do well to repent. Paul tells us that our salvation depends on it. Until next time...
