# **Three Problems with a Performance Worship Model**

Is the priority in corporate worship the smooth, exhilarating, and entertaining performance of professionals on a stage before a doting, enthusiastic audience, or is the priority in worship the heart-felt participation of every worshiper (from those in the pulpit to those in the pew) in worship to God? Some would argue that this is a false dichotomy, but I'm not so sure about that. I believe the words performance and participation represent diametrically opposed models for worship, and I would argue that the performance worship model has at least three glaring problems.

A performance worship model encourages observation, not participation. A performance worship model effectively turns worship into a concert. In such a setting, many people in the "pew" become guilty of proxy or passive worship, allowing the ones on stage to do their worshiping for them. It is true that under the Levitical system of the Old Covenant that the priest was the one through whom the people offered their sacrifices to God, but under the New Covenant, all Christians are priests (1 Pet. 2:9) who are expected to offer sacrifices to God (Heb. 13:15). It is also true that we live in a spectator, entertainment-driven society, which has influenced many people's idea about what worship should entail. However, the true heart of worship is not in observation but in participation with a true heart.

A performance worship model promotes the sensational and sensual, not the spiritual. In other words, a performance worship model substitutes style and splendor for substance. Many churches think they must do the former in order to attract or even keep new converts. Increasingly, churches are adopting an entertainment format in their worship services. There's the light show in combination with the slick graphics, the carefully crafted musical compositions of varying tempos, the intermittent pep-rally chants for Jesus, and a "message" that is based more on pop psychology than Scripture or that expounds simple platitudes rather than Christian doctrine. Jesus' instruction to the Twelve in Matthew 10:14 was basically, "If you can't win people with substance, move on," not "If you can't win people with substance, try to win them with style and splendor."

In John 6:66, many of Jesus' disciples walked away from him. After they had turned away, Jesus turned to the Twelve and said, "You do not want to go away also, do you?" Peter replied, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." When churches try to win people to Christ largely by making Christian worship a fun, exhilarating, and entertaining experience, they are changing the fundamental appeal of Christianity. The appeal of Christianity is not because it is fun and entertaining, but because it is true. If people are not interested in following Christ because what He offers is true, we must not try to get them to follow Christ for some other reason. If people are not interested in substance, we must not try to win them with style. If people are not following Christ because He is "the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6), then their discipleship is a sham. If people are worshiping God largely because, as one worshiper told Peter Jennings on ABC News, "It's like going to a movie, only better," then their worship is a sham. Let's not be guilty of opting for the sensational or the sensual over what is truly spiritual.

A performance worship model inspires idolization of the performers, not veneration for God. Take a moment to read Matthew 6:1-8. Jesus essentially taught that God has no reward for worship that is designed to be a performance for other people. Worship is not for a band, or a preacher even, to put on a "performance." Worship is not for people to show off their talents. Worship is not a production. Worship is not treating an audience to a theme-park style "experience." Since Jesus says performance worship has no reward from God, true worshipers will not seek to honor themselves or inspire idolization of themselves with their great performance. True worshipers bring a desire to venerate or honor God alone.
