Reasons for Christ's Preeminence

Part Four

In Colossians 1:18-20, Paul writes the following about Jesus Christ: "And he is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross." Jesus is preeminent because He is the **reconciler**.

Jesus is not only the Lord of creation; He is also the Lord of the new creation. Just as creation depends on Him for its existence and order, so re-creation (i.e., redemption or reconciliation) depends on Him. He is the primary figure in both domains. He is the center of creation and the church.

The term "beginning" is explained by "firstborn": "He is the beginning, that is, the firstborn from the dead." Jesus isn't the only person to be brought back from the dead, but He is the first one to be brought back from the dead never to die again. He is the "firstfruits" (1 Cor. 15:20-24). Christ's resurrection, though presently unique, will be acted out by a great company of others. Moreover, Jesus' resurrection was accomplished "that in everything he might be preeminent." Christ's resurrection gave Him publicly the status that He always enjoyed by right (cf. Rom. 1:4).

There is no word for "God" in the original of vs. 19, but the grammatical subject "fullness" must be a circumlocution for "God in all his fullness." It is appropriate that Christ should hold preeminence because God in all His fullness was pleased to reside in him. The full deity of the man Jesus is stated without any implication that there are two gods. Furthermore, God wasn't just pleased to dwell in Christ; He was pleased to reconcile the world to Himself through Christ.

In the span of three verses, Christ's deity, crucifixion, resurrection, and church are all mentioned. I heard David Shannon, FHU's president, say one time: "God wants to create us twice." Without Christ's work of reconciliation and redemption as the God-Man, we could not be created a second time, so to speak. All hope of becoming a new creature is inextricably tied to Jesus Christ. Because Jesus entered the world that He created in the past and sustains in the present, because He submitted to a shameful death on the cross, and because He was resurrected from the dead (cf. 1 Cor. 15:20-24), we can be reconciled to God, and nothing is more important than having peace with God. You and I have substantial reasons to hold Jesus Christ in the highest esteem. Does your life currently reflect that you acknowledge Christ's preeminence?
