Solitude and Silence

Though solitude and silence can obviously be distinguished from one another, they are companion spiritual disciplines. As Kenneth Boa says, "[S]ilence gives depth to solitude, and solitude creates a place for silence" (*Conformed to His Image* 88).

Perhaps more than any generation in history we must discipline ourselves to enjoy the blessings of solitude and silence. Our culture conditions us to be comfortable with busyness, schedules, deadlines, noise, and crowds, not with solitude and silence. In her book *Finding Focus in a Whirlwind World*, Jean Fleming observes, "We live in a noisy, busy world. Silence and solitude . . . fit the era of Victorian lace, high-button shoes, and kerosene lamps better than our age of television, video arcades, and joggers wired with earphones. We have become a people with an aversion to quiet and an uneasiness with being alone" (73). So many of us are uncomfortable being in a car or home without some "background noise." Many of us don't sleep without some white noise or a fan. The portability of technology with its never-ending supply of news, social media, videos, reels, podcasts, games, and music has almost eliminated all quiet spaces in our lives.

The Scriptures teach that Jesus engaged in periods of solitude and silence, some for only a few minutes or hours and at least one for several days on end. In the solitude of the desert, Jesus prepared to inaugurate His public ministry (Matthew 4:1-11). In the solitude of the mountain, Jesus prepared to select His disciples (Luke 6:12-13). In the solitude of the garden, Jesus prepared to sacrifice His life for the sins of the world (Matt. 26:36-46). Other passages in the Gospels reveal that solitude was an indispensable practice in the life of Jesus. For instance, in Matthew 14:23, we read, "And after he dismissed the crowds, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone" (cf. Mark 1:35; Luke 4:42; John 6:15). Luke 5:16 records that Jesus "would withdraw to desolate places to pray."

The point should be obvious: *To be more like Jesus, we must discipline ourselves to find times of solitude and silence.* During those times, we can devote ourselves to praying to God, meditating on God's Word, and evaluating our lives in light of God's will. Solitude and silence purge us of arrogance and autonomy and foster humility and trust, moving us in the direction of greater Christlikeness.
