The Spiritual Impact of Our Social Lives

Scripture teaches and our experience confirms that our social life powerfully impacts our spiritual life. It can impact it for good or evil. The people who are closest to us and the people with whom we surround ourselves will either be a great help to us or a great hurt to us in terms of our relationship with God.

To the church in Corinth, Paul writes, "Do not be deceived: 'Bad company corrupts good morals.'" (1 Cor. 15:33). Paul didn't send these words to the high school class at the Corinth Church of Christ. He didn't say this at a youth rally in Corinth or at a youth conference in the region of Achaia. He wrote these words to the whole church, most of whom were mature adults. Not one of us is beyond being influenced by other people. We are all impressionable to a greater or lesser extent no matter our age. Paul doesn't want the Corinthians to deceive themselves into thinking that their social life doesn't have any impact on their spiritual life. A negative social life can destroy a Christian's spiritual life like few things can.

Fortunately, it can go the other way. In Proverbs 13:20, Solomon writes: "Whoever walks with the wise becomes wise, but the companion of fools will suffer harm." Not only does he say that "the companion of fools will suffer harm," which is akin to "bad company ruins good morals," but he also says that "whoever walks with the wise becomes wise." If we associate ourselves with those who have the proper attitude toward life in general, other people, and God, then we will start developing and reflecting those same attitudes in our own lives.

For most people, before they had a relationship with Christ, they had a relationship with a Christian or maybe several Christians, and it's those Christians and the godly influence those people had on their lives that led them to Christ. I'd venture to say that if you are a Christian, then you, too, are where you're at spiritually because of somebody else. Other people can obviously have a profound impact on our spiritual life, so let's scrutinize our current social life and determine whether it's helping, *hindering*, or *hurting* us spiritually.
