In his book Is God a Moral Monster? (2011), Paul Copan outlines three things that summarize the New Atheists' arguments in their criticism of theism. First, for all their emphasis on cool-headed, scientific rationality, the New Atheists, like Richard Dawkins and Sam Harris, express themselves not just passionately but angrily. Second, the New Atheists' arguments against God's existence are surprisingly flimsy, often resembling the simplistic village atheist far more than the credentialed academician. Their arguments are a collage of rhetorical barbs that don't really form a coherent argument. Third, the New Atheists aren't willing to own up to atrocities committed in the name of atheism by Stalin, Pol Pot, or Mao Zedong, yet they expect Christians to own up to all barbaric acts performed in God's or Jesus' name. For the New Atheists, religion poisons everything, and atheism poisons nothing. A Christian might wonder why or how a person can disbelieve in God.

In diagnosing unbelief, the biblical view is that unbelief stems from one's willful abuse of the truth. We're either a truth-seeker or a truth-twister, though we've all been guilty at some point of trying to conform reality to our thinking rather than conforming our thinking to reality. In Romans 1:18, Paul says that those who disobey God "suppress the truth in unrighteousness." What may be known about God, Paul says, is guite evident (Rom. 1:20), but it is adamantly denied by a determined act of will. Unbelief is the result of continuing to suppress the truth, which leads to an inescapable tension, because the truth is still always the truth, so no one can completely get away from it.

Aldous Huxley, an avowed atheist, even nihilist, said that "no philosophy is completely disinterested." In other words, everyone thinks for both "intellectual reasons" (based on truth) and "voluntary reasons" (based on desires and the will). Huxley admitted, "I had motives for not wanting the world to have meaning; consequently, I assumed that it had none, and was able without any difficulty to find satisfying reasons for this assumption." His philosophy of meaninglessness was far from disinterested. And what was the reason he and his colleagues didn't want their actions to mean anything? "We objected to morality because it interfered with our sexual freedom." This honest admission is extraordinary, but it gets at what we're saying here. From a biblical perspective, atheism is the result of deliberately suppressing the truth for one reason or another. The question for an atheist is not really "Why don't you believe?" but "Why do you not want to believe?" At the end of the day, the heart of the problem is a problem of the heart.
