Leaning on God

The Book of Proverbs isn't like so many of our modern-day self-help books that tell us how great we are and how we can do it all on our own. It does just the opposite. It tells us not to think of ourselves too highly but to think of God highly. Proverbs decries self-sufficiency and self-dependence. Proverbs reminds us that we don't have it all figured out. Proverbs says that know-it-alls are worse than fools: "Do you see a man who is wise in his own eyes? There is more hope for a fool than for him" (Prov. 26:12). We are never wiser than when we recognize our own foolishness, and we're never more foolish than when we think we are wise.

Proverbs 3:5-6 is a key passage in this discussion, and since these verses find their way into many inspirational graduate cards and onto the wall in many homes, it's important to clarify what it's not saying and what it is saying. Not a few folks believe that Proverbs 3:5-6 implies that God has a rather detailed plan for our lives, like what we will do for a living, where we will live, and who we will marry. If we want to experience what He has in store for our lives, then we have to trust Him, seek to discern His particular "will" for our lives, and allow Him to guide us along His path for our lives, as if He's got everything mapped out for us, even down to the tiniest of details. But is this true? I don't think so. God has endowed us with the freedom to make genuine choices in every area of our lives.

God doesn't so much tell us what career we are supposed to choose, but He has told us in Scripture to choose a job that is ethical, fair, and just, and to work diligently (cf. 1 Thess. 4:11-12; 2 Thess. 3:6-12). God doesn't so much tell us where to live, but He does tell us to love and treat our neighbors well wherever we might reside. God doesn't so much tell us exactly whom we are supposed to marry (see Num. 36:6), but He does discuss the origin, sanctity, purposes, dynamic, and duration of marriage (cf. Gen. 2:18, 21-25; Matt. 19:1-12; 1 Cor. 7; Eph. 5:22-33).

The thrust of Proverbs 3:5-6 is that we are not to separate our will from God's desired will as expressed in Scripture. If God says to live a certain way (even if we find it hard to understand or difficult to do), we must surrender our will to His will. We are to trust God fully and obey Him completely. We are to make God the center of our universe. We are not to live independently of Him. We are to lean on Him and His understanding, not our own.
