John 3:16, a verse known and cherished by many, expresses God's love for the world in terms of giving His only Son. The Father gave us His Son, and this is important to note, because sometimes people set the Father and the Son in opposition. They see the Father as a stern judge who sentences sinners to hell, and into this picture comes a loving Son who intervenes to save them. But any view of the crucifixion that does not see it as coming from the Father's love is wrong.

Nevertheless, for the purposes of this article, we must also insist that the Son gave Himself, lest someone tries to argue that the Father forced the Son to do something against His will. In 1 John 3:16, we read, "By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us...." Both the Father and the Son were committed to the crucifixion.

That Jesus' crucifixion was voluntary is emphasized in John 10:17-18, where Jesus says, "For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life that I may take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from my Father."

On several occasions, Paul tells us that Christ "gave himself." To the Ephesians, for instance, he writes: "And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God" (Eph. 5:2). To Timothy, Paul writes that Jesus "gave himself as a ransom for all" (1 Tim. 2:6). In his letter to Titus, Paul refers to Jesus as "our great God and Savior," stating that He "gave himself for us to redeem us" (2:13-14).

People did not volunteer for a Roman crucifixion. In fact, it is hard to imagine anyone willingly walking the road to Golgotha to have their wrists and feet nailed to wooden beams. But Jesus did! Unlike everyone else sentenced to die on a Roman cross, Jesus could have called twelve legions of angels to rescue Him at any moment (Matt. 26:53). But He didn't! Jesus willingly laid down His life at the "Place of the Skull" (Matt. 27:33-35).
