The Pornography Problem

Part Three

Having highlighted both the biblical principles relative to this discussion and the monumental problem pornography has become in America, not to mention the world, it's time to note some ways of preventing pornography from becoming a problem in your home. If you want to porn-proof your home, then below are a couple of things you need to do.

Monitor all devices. First, it would be wise to install filtering and accountability software on all devices. CovenantEyes offers lots of free resources, but their family plan for their filtering and accountability software comes at a price of \$16.99/month. It keeps tabs on what sites are visited in the home and who viewed them, and you can choose an "ally" (e.g., spouse, parent, or friend) to help keep you accountable. X3Watch offers free accountability reporting software that will send email reports of sites visited and flag the ones that shouldn't have been visited. Second, don't forget to take advantage of parental controls. Such controls are available as a free feature on many devices, particularly cell phones and tablets. You can make app downloads inaccessible to children. You can also prevent your children from accessing certain features on a phone. Spouses can create barriers or guardrails for one another.

Maintain open dialogue. Communication is vital. Couples need to be transparent. Parents need to address this topic with their children. Parents, we must come to grips with the fact that no matter how good our children may be, they will be confronted with the reality of porn. If they don't know where to turn when that happens, it could potentially turn into an addiction. We should expect exposure to happen at some time and in some way. We must establish a channel of communication with our children, so that when they are exposed to pornography, they will feel comfortable coming to us.

If you are regularly viewing pornography, then you're going to need some help stopping it. You're going to need forgiveness from God and potentially from family members. You're going to need some counseling. You're going to need some accountability, and since we have a leadership and a church that desires to implement Galatians 6:1-2, we will help you obtain all three. No doubt you fear a public confession, but you can contact one of the elders or me or Jeremy. You've got to shed light on this. One of Satan's greatest tools is shame. One of the biggest barriers to overcoming a sin is shame. We don't confess it to ourselves and/or others, so we keep on committing it. Break that cycle. Let us help you bear your burden. The Lord's church should be a safe place for sinners, not in the sense of celebrating or condoning their sin, but in the sense of graciously and gently helping sinners overcome their sin, whatever that sin might be.
