Making Peace with God

The date was April 9, 1865. Ulysses S. Grant jogged along the Virginia road that led to Appomattox Court House, where he was to meet with General Robert E. Lee. The mighty guns of war were silent. Two armies sat motionless on either side of the road. General Grant proved to be guite conciliatory. His terms of surrender were simple and gracious. He allowed the confederate officers to keep their weapons, permitted each soldier to keep a horse or mule, fed Lee's starving army with Union rations, and prevented his soldiers from celebrating. The victor was gracious. This is a picture of how God has treated us.

Grace is the cause of reconciliation. Peace with God is offered to humanity as a gift. None of us will ever be good enough or righteous enough on our own to make peace with God. Our actions can only earn the wage of death, i.e., eternal alienation (Rom. 6:23a). Fortunately, God offers us eternal life as a gift (Rom. 6:23b). You earn a wage. You receive a gift because someone loves you.

Faith is the means of reconciliation. It is through the exercise of faith that we accept and receive the gift. Even though peace with God is a gift, the gift must be accepted. If I offer you a gift, you can either reach out and accept it or you can reject it. Faith is how we reach out and accept the gift of God. Faith is the means of making peace with God. In Romans 5:1-2, we read, "Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand. . . . " Furthermore, Ephesians 2:8 reads: "For by grace you have been saved through faith." Again, grace is the cause of peace with God; faith is the means of making peace with God.

The exchange of the gift, whereby we are reconciled to God, occurs at our baptism. Now, is there any way of knowing when our faith has accepted the gift? Is there a time of exchange that we can point to when peace with God initially occurs? Paul tells us when we are justified in Romans 6:6-8. Take a moment to read these three verses. The word translated as "set free" in verse 7 is the same word that is translated as "justified" in Romans 5:1. Paul says we were "justified" or "set free" from our sins when we "died with Christ." Romans 6:2-4 teaches that we died with Christ at our baptism. Baptism expresses our faith to God (Col. 2:11-12). It tells Him we want the gift. God extends the gift of reconciliation to us through the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus; we accept the gift through reenacting the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus at our baptism.

Our reconciliation to God comes with certain responsibilities. God gives us new spiritual lives when we express our faith in baptism (Rom. 6:4). He then calls on us to devote our new lives to serving Him. Conversion must be followed by commitment. Transition must be followed by transformation. Reconciliation must be followed by righteousness. Having peace with God took the sacrifice of God's Son; it only makes sense that we would offer ourselves as "living sacrifices" (Rom. 12:1-2).
