The Pornography Problem

Part One

If I were to ask you to identify the strongest man in the Bible, you would probably answer "Samson." If I were to ask you to tell me Israel's greatest king, you would probably answer "David." If I were to ask you to pinpoint the wisest man in the Bible, you would probably answer "Solomon." Have you ever thought about what all three of these guys had in common? One preacher said, "If you think you can't fall into sexual sin, then you're stronger than Samson, godlier than David, and wiser than Solomon." Here's what we all know to be true or should know to be true: illicit sexual acts first begin with an illicit desire, and God pleads with us through His Word to manage our desires.

The Greek noun *epithymia* is based on the root word *thymos*, meaning "an urge" or "passion," and is often translated "desire(s)." Sometimes this word appears in a more mundane (or positive) sense in the NT. For instance, in 1 Thessalonians 2:17, we read: "But since we were torn away from you, brothers, for a short time, in person not in heart, we endeavored the more eagerly and with **great desire** to see you face to face" (emphasis mine; cf. Phil. 1:21-23). Nevertheless, *epithymia* generally constitutes wrong sensual and sexual desires, i.e., lusts. The Christian life entails, among other things, the crucifixion of the "flesh with its passions and desires" (Gal. 5:24).

What we've said about the noun is also true of the verb. Context determines meaning. *Epithymeo* variously means "to desire earnestly, long for something, lust, covet." In a positive sense, this verb denotes the earnest longing of the prophets and the righteous to see the messianic fulfillment in Jesus' ministry (Matt. 13:17) and the angels' longing to look into the wonder of salvation (1 Pet. 1:12). It describes the prodigal son's longing to eat the pig's pods (Luke 15:16) and Lazarus's longing to eat the crumbs that fell from the rich man's table (Luke 16:21). Jesus tells his disciples that He eagerly desired to eat the Passover with them (Luke 22:15). Paul thinks that the desire to be an elder or overseer is a good thing (1 Tim. 3:1), and the writer of Hebrews desires for his readers to continue diligently in spiritual growth (Heb. 6:11).

Instances of a more negative use of this verb are easily found in the NT. In Matthew 5:28-29, for example, Jesus highlights the illegality of lust: "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you that **everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent** has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body be thrown into hell" (emphasis added). Some longings are fine; others are not. Again, desire can be a good thing. If it weren't for sexual desire, the number of marriages would be drastically lower, and you and I may not have been born. In a healthy marriage, desire is alive and well—and focused (cf. 1 Cor. 7:2-5; Heb. 13:4). It's perfectly fine to desire, long for, and "lust" after your spouse. But lusting after someone who is not your spouse is a problem in God's eyes; thus, we need to pay attention to what we put before our eyes or how we respond to what comes before our eyes (Ps. 101:3; Job 31:1).

The lust factory that is plaguing our society in the twenty-first century is the porn industry. Pornography is sexually explicit material in pictures or videos that is intended for the purpose of sexual arousal. Its use has reached epidemic proportions, affecting both men and women, whether non-Christian or Christian. In next week's article, I'll demonstrate just how pervasive and pernicious the pornography problem is, and in a couple of weeks, I'll discuss what we can do to protect ourselves and our families.
