Just prior to being betrayed by one of His own, Jesus instituted the so-called Lord's Supper during the Passover feast of the Jews. He told His disciples what this supper meant, what elements they were to use, and how they were to observe it.

The Passover meal was a Jewish memorial meal to remember the Exodus from Egypt (Exodus 12). An important part of the feast was the Passover lamb that was killed and eaten by every Israelite in every Israelite household. Before the actual Exodus, the Israelites placed the blood of the slain lamb on their doorposts. This act saved the Israelites from the plaque of death that came upon the firstborn in all of Egypt.

The Passover feast of the Jews is not the same thing as the Lord's Supper Jesus gave to His disciples, but the symbolism is similar. Both memorial feasts focus on the most significant event of their respective histories. Both center upon a bloody sacrifice. The Jews had the blood of the Passover lamb that saved them from death in Egypt. Christians have the blood of Jesus, "our Passover lamb" (1 Cor. 5:7), that saves them from sin and its penalty. Jesus connected the symbolism when He said, "I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer; for I say to you, I shall never again eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God" (Luke 22:15-16). Through this meal, followers of Christ could remember His crucified body and shed blood.

The elements of the Lord's Supper were unleavened bread and the fruit of the vine (i.e., juice from a grape), both of which were food items used in the Passover meal. The bread was unleavened to remember that the Exodus happened rapidly, not allowing time for leaven to make the bread rise. Other kinds of food were on the Passover table, such as roasted lamb and bitter herbs, but Jesus chose unleavened bread and the fruit of the vine. In my judgment, it is the sin of presumption to change what Jesus chose.

Moreover, in His institution of the Lord's Supper, Jesus indicated that this would not be the last time and place in which He would observe this feast with His disciples. In Mark 14:25, we read: "Truly, I say to you, I will not drink again of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." Through this meal, Jesus would continue to commune with His people in the kingdom, the present manifestation of which is Christ's church that was established about fifty days after Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection (Acts 2).

What Jesus instituted during that Passover meal on the night He was betrayed, He expected to continue, and we will discuss this continuance in next week's article.
