### **Parental Wisdom from Proverbs**

#### Teach Them

The Book of Proverbs affirms that the main job of parents is to teach their children to know right from wrong, good from evil, and wisdom from foolishness. Proverbs 1:8-9 reads, "Hear, my son, your father's instruction, and forsake not your mother's teaching, for they are a graceful garland for your head and pendants for your neck." Similarly, in Proverbs 4:1-4, we read, "Hear, O sons, a father's instruction, and be attentive, that you may gain insight, for I give good precepts; do not forsake my teaching. When I was a son with my father, tender, the only one in the sight of my mother, he taught me and said to me, 'Let your heart hold fast my words; keep my commandments and live.'"

The modern view of parenting is that parents should mainly be supportive and allow children to do self-discovery. Proverbs teaches that the goal of parenting is neither mere control nor affirmation but to teach children to become God-fearing and wise.

It is folly to expect a child to work out for himself or herself the moral wisdom of the ages. What makes a person capable of coming up with a standard of right and wrong is not that their parents taught them exactly right but that their parents *did* teach them. If a child's parents held a coherent account of good and evil and tried to impart it, even if later it is rejected in whole or part, at the very least the child will have developed a critical moral faculty. If, instead, the parents just let their child grow up as a detached, autonomous self, that's parental malpractice. We should do for our children what our heavenly Father did for us when He sent Jesus to us with His fatherly teaching.

Parents, we are the most important teachers that our children will ever have. Though they may not see it until they are in their mid-20s or so, they will one day realize that you were a lot more intelligent and wiser than they could have ever thought.

The Bible was once the basic textbook in the educational system, but even if that were still true, the Bible in the school can't replace the Bible in the home. Some might even argue that the Bible in the church can't replace the Bible in the home.

As parents, we sacrifice so much time and money to help our children excel in school, sports, and other social activities, but shouldn't we be even more concerned that our children are excelling in knowing and obeying God's Word and navigating life well?
