Watch Your Walk

British statesman Edmund Burke called *example* the "school of mankind," and its first lessons are learned in the home even before the children can speak. Benjamin Franklin said that *example* was "the best sermon," which suggests that the way parents act in the home teaches their children more about living a godly life than what the children hear in Sunday school or a worship service.

In Proverbs 20:7, we read, "The righteous who walks in his integrity—blessed are his children after him!" How do we pass our fear of God, love for God, and wisdom on to our children so that they make it their own? There are a few factors. The first is words. We must open our mouths and instruct. The second one is our *walk*, i.e., our integrity or blameless life, which doesn't speak to perfection, but consistency.

Children are highly sensitive to perceived hypocrisy, which will undermine all efforts to pass on wisdom to our children. Telling our children to do what we say but not what we do is ridiculous. Children will see what we do before they hear what we say. The best way to train our kids to be righteous is to be righteous ourselves. And when we do fail, we should repent and apologize to our children, especially if we have wronged them.

In Proverbs 23:26, we read, "My son, give me your heart, and let your eyes observe my ways." Parents, is that something you could request of your children? Do you want your children to observe your ways? Is your walk consistent with your words?


