Childish Christians

I suspect you probably remember some of the older Cheez-it commercials. The setting was often a "Maturation Room." The man holding the clipboard in the commercial was responsible for deciding whether the cheese was ready to be turned into Cheez-its. Inevitably, the cheese proved to be childish, immature, or simply annoying, and a check was placed next to "Not Ready." The overarching message of these commercials was that only "mature cheese" is used to produce Cheez-its.

Like the cheese in this commercial, Christians can be childish, immature, and even annoying. However, while the cheese must be mature before it can become a Cheez-it, a person does not have to be spiritually mature before becoming a Christian. In fact, most people who become Christians are far from spiritually mature, but God does expect them to grow (1 Cor. 13:11; Heb. 5:11-14).

The problem occurs when Christians are unwilling to mature and supplement their faith (2 Pet. 1:5-11). Below is a non-exhaustive list of different kinds of childish Christians:

- **Morning Glories**. These Christians, whose maximum service to God is Sunday morning worship and sometimes not that, have failed to realize that Christianity is a daily enterprise as opposed to an event or two each week (cf. Luke 9:23).
- **Money Grubbers**. These Christians love money too much (1 Tim. 6:10). Their money owns them as opposed to the other way around (Matt. 6:24), and they struggle to be generous (cf. 1 Tim. 6:17-19).
- **Green-Eyed Christians**. Envious and resentful, these Christians treat with contempt other Christians whom they perceive are more successful or blessed (cf. 1 Cor. 13:4-5). They have a hard time rejoicing with those who rejoice (Rom. 12:15b).
- **Light-Switch Christians**—These Christians are unstable in the Lord (cf. Jas. 1:6-7). They are on again, off again. Events inside and outside the church cause them to move like the mercury in a thermometer. They are often unwilling to deal with conflict or persecution when it arises and unable to maintain fervency in serving the Lord and His people (cf. Rom. 12:11; 1 Cor. 15:58).
- "I"-Troubled Christians—These Christians have a very high opinion of themselves and their opinions. Their inflated ego regularly puts them at odds with others in a wide variety of situations. They find it impossible to look to the interests of others (Phil. 2:3-4) or weep with those who weep (Rom. 12:15a), and if they manage to become a spiritual shepherd, they will play the part of Diotrephes (3 John 9-10).
- Sour Christians—These Christians don't embody joy (cf. Gal. 5:22; Phil. 4:4), and no one can remember the last time they
 actually smiled, made a kind statement, or offered a friendly gesture.

Most little kids I've known want to be considered big boys and big girls. They want to grow. They want to get bigger. They don't want to stay where they are. Unfortunately, not a few Christians become content with their spiritual immaturity. They want the blessing of being saved or forgiven, but they don't want the responsibility of growing. May we all refuse to stay where we are spiritually and continue to pursue Christ's likeness (Col. 1:24-28).
