Being Real with God

In the biblical book that bears his name, Job was extremely transparent with God throughout his suffering, and some of what Job says to God or about God can make us a bit uncomfortable. But Job didn’t hide his fears, frustrations, or fury. He didn’t hide his suffering or sorrow. He didn’t hide his confusion or his concerns. He got out what was inside of him. He gave voice to all that he was feeling and thinking, even if it was disturbing.

Consider Job’s complaint in Job 19:7-12: “Behold, I cry out, ‘Violence!’ but I am not answered; I call for help, but there is no justice. He has walled up my way, so that I cannot pass, and he has set darkness upon my paths. He has stripped from me my glory and taken the crown from my head. He breaks me down on every side, and I am gone, and my hope he has pulled up like a tree. He has kindled his wrath against me and counts me as his adversary. His troops come on together; they have cast up their siege ramp against me and encamp around my tent.”

Later, in Job 30:16-23, we find this lament: “And now my soul is poured out within me; days of affliction have taken hold of me. The night racks my bones, and the pain that gnaws me takes no rest. With great force my garment is disfigured; it binds me about like the collar of my tunic. God has cast me into the mire, and I have become like dust and ashes. I cry to you for help and you do not answer me; I stand, and you only look at me. You have turned cruel to me; with the might of your hand you persecute me. You lift me up on the wind; you make me ride on it, and you toss me about in the roar of the storm. For I know that you will bring me to death and to the house appointed for all living.”

I don’t know about you, but I couldn’t imagine saying these kinds of things about God, much less to God. But Job candidly addressed the Lord of heaven and earth. Job understood and appreciated something that we often forget: *You can’t hide your thoughts, doubts, concerns, anxieties, questions, or complaints from God* (cf. 1 John 3:20). He’s intimately aware of what is going on inside of our hearts and minds, and he wants us to lay those things bare. He wants us to be real with him. He wants us to be up front. He’s perfectly at home with us bringing these things to his throne (Heb. 4:16). He wants us to work out what we are feeling and thinking in the context of our relationship with him (cf. 1 Pet. 5:6-7).
