#### Closing it out

As early as Deuteronomy 24:6, we find a command regarding pledges that references a millstone: "No one shall take a mill or an upper millstone in pledge, for that would be taking a life in pledge." Later, in Judges 9:53, we read that Abimelech, a king/judge in Israel, was killed when a woman threw an upper millstone down from the wall and crushed his skull.

Millstones are mentioned eight or nine times in Scripture, depending on which version you are reading. We can be certain that they were used regularly, even if they weren't mentioned frequently in the pages of the Bible.

Perhaps the most memorable mention of the millstone in Scripture is what we find in Mark 9:42, which reads, "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were hung around his neck and he were thrown into the sea." Jesus was clear that He did not want us to cause our children to sin! Those of us who are parents, adults, or even teenagers have children looking to us for guidance. We should not take this responsibility lightly, and we should view it with the same gravity that the Lord did.
