The Integrity of the Bible

The Bible is filled with historical names, places, and events and covers a period of more than four thousand years. It speaks of actual empires, nations, and rulers. The OT mentions historical groups of people, such as the Canaanites, Moabites, and Philistines. The NT details the names and titles of various people in the Roman Empire and the Jewish nation. It records the location of cities and ports as well as the distances and travel times between them. It includes data about the customs, politics, and even the food and clothing of its time. And time and time again the discipline of archaeology has vindicated the integrity of the Bible.

One of the most dramatic illustrations of how archaeology has confirmed the historical reliability of the Bible is in the story of Sargon. This Assyrian monarch is mentioned in the Bible only in Isaiah 20:1. For a long time, it was thought that Isaiah had made a mistake calling Sargon a king of Assyria. Perhaps he had confused him with some other monarch, or maybe Sargon was only a general under the king. Historians had names and records of all the great kings of Assyria, and this Sargon wasn’t among them.

In 1843, Paul-Émile Botta made an astounding discovery at Khorsabad, near Nineveh. He had not enjoyed much success in his work in Nineveh. On a suggestion from one of the workers, he went to Khorsabad to try his luck, and there he uncovered the temple, palace, and numerous records of Sargon. He found out why Sargon was not named in the other lists of Assyrian kings. Sargon was a usurper. He took the name *Sargon* after an earlier ruler. Maybe he thought if he had a good name, then that would establish his claim to the throne. There is no longer any serious doubt concerning the accuracy of Isaiah 20:1.

Critics of the New Testament asserted for many years that Luke was mistaken in his use of the term “politarchs” for the officials of Thessalonica before whom Paul was taken (Acts 17:6, 8). An inscription using this term, however, was found on the Vardar Arch at the west end of the modern Odos Egnatia Street (once known as Vardar Street). This first-century arch was torn down in 1867 to be used in the repair of the city’s walls. The inscription from the arch, which was subsequently found and is now in the British Museum, begins with the following words: “In the time of the Politarchs. . . .” Other inscriptions have since been found that substantiate the fact that politarchs existed in Macedonia long before the apostle Paul arrived.

The archaeologist Nelson Glueck observes: “It may be stated categorically that no archaeological discovery has ever controverted a Biblical reference. Scores of archaeological findings have been made which confirm in clear outline or exact detail historical statements in the Bible. And, by the same token, proper evaluation of Biblical descriptions has often led to amazing discoveries.” Those who believe that the Bible was breathed out by God (cf. 2 Tim. 3:16-17) don’t necessarily need archaeology to confirm the Bible’s contents, but perhaps such discoveries can be used to cast pebbles in the shoes of those who enjoy discrediting the Bible.
