For those who are contemplating a change in their spiritual lives, there is a fear or worry that consumes some people. They are concerned, even scared, about how their grandparents, parents, or even spouse will react.

Let's say her name is Jenny. She grew up in a home where God's name was never mentioned unless it was in vain. Her parents were unbelievers. Her family never went to church, never prayed together, and never contemplated what lies beyond the grave. After all, as far as her parents were concerned, when you die, it's over, and all anyone has to look forward to is endless nonexistence. They've been quite outspoken against Christianity, not to mention all religions. But imagine Jenny has a friend who invites her to church. She's contemplating going with her friend, but then she thinks of how her parents might respond. In the thinking and wisdom of her parents, religion, God, and church are best left alone. She's afraid of disrespecting her parents. She's afraid that they might be disappointed in her.

Let's say his name is Johnny. His situation is similar, except in his case, he's contemplating attending a church that is different in name, beliefs, and practices from the church he grew up attending with his family. Johnny has been doing some independent thinking lately. He's been confronted with certain teachings or emphases that he was not regularly exposed to at the church he attended most of his life. Nevertheless, his stomach turns when he imagines how his family might respond when he decides to chart his own course in pursuit of God.

In either one of these cases, to go against family wishes and wisdom requires a great deal of courage. Oftentimes, it can really cost the person who makes the decision not to follow in his/her family's footsteps. In Matthew 10, Jesus is addressing his twelve disciples, and he's preparing them for some terrifying realities. They will be persecuted. They will be betrayed. They could be killed. They will face pressure to deny their Lord. Jesus also tells them that they may lose or be forced to forfeit some of their closest and most meaningful relationships (cf. Luke 14:26). In light of these possibilities, Jesus implores his disciples to do two things. First, they must fear God more than anyone (vs. 28). Second, they must love Christ more than anyone (vs. 37). These are God's expectations in cases like Jenny's and Johnny's.
