A Bad Experience

Early in our marriage, Brit and I went to The Melting Pot for our anniversary. The food was great going down. It started with the cheese fondue, moved to the meat fondue, and ended with the chocolate fondue. At the time, Brit was eight months pregnant with Reese. Later that evening around midnight, our stomachs started feeling weird. Within the hour, we had all the proof we needed that we had food poisoning. In the aftermath, we suspected that we may have failed to prepare one of the meats properly. It was a horrendously bad experience, and we haven't been back to The Melting Pot since then because we fear a reoccurrence of food poisoning.

Some folks have had a bad experience with a church, and they don't intend on returning to that church or visiting any other church as a result. The spectrum ranges from no one talking to them to someone abusing them in some way. Perhaps in between those two extremes is someone gossiping about them or someone admonishing them too harshly and hurting their feelings. In some instances, a church can be so polarized and seemingly unloving that visitors are scared away.

Bad experiences in church are nothing new. Imagine being a part of the church that John wrote to in 3 John. Here's what John wrote about a guy named Diotrephes: "I have written something to the church, but Diotrephes, who likes to put himself first, does not acknowledge our authority. So if I come, I will bring up what he is doing, talking wicked nonsense against us. And not content with that, he refuses to welcome the brothers, and also stops those who want to and puts them out of the church" (vv. 9-10). Imagine if you had been one of those wanting to be part of the church, but some guy arbitrarily prevented you from being a part of the church. You might just get mad and vow never to return.

There are two things worth contemplating and communicating to others on this point. First, churches, like people, need grace, too. No church is perfect; every church is capable of disappointing you in some way. Second, it's not fair to judge the best of us by the worst of us. In any case, God still calls people to join their lives with like-minded believers (Rom. 12; 1 Cor. 12), so while a bad experience might alienate a person from a given church, such should not be used as an excuse to give up completely on finding a community of Christians with whom he or she can worship and work.

For those of us who are members of Christ's church, we should allow this discussion to remind us of how careful we need to be. Not only must we watch how we conduct ourselves before outsiders (Col. 4:5), but we must work hard to maintain a spirit of unity and love among us (Eph. 4:1-3).


