Have you ever been the outside person on an "inside joke"? Folks are laughing, and you have no idea why. Not being "in the know" is an uncomfortable place to be. Well, visitors can often feel like this in a worship setting. Those of us who have been Christians for a long time take a lot for granted, especially when it comes to our vocabulary. The church has a lingo, and if you're not "in the know," you may be afraid to speak for fear of making a mistake or afraid to ask for clarification when you don't immediately grasp the jargon.

There are several lingo issues afoot. First, there are those instances when visitors or prospects use incorrect vocabulary. For instance, they may refer to me (the preacher) as the "pastor" or "reverend," or they may refer to our auditorium as the "sanctuary." It's not best to immediately correct them when they misuse or misapply a word. Let's exercise patience and teach them progressively. Second, there is language that we may refer to as *church-only vocabulary*. Examples would include "providentially hindered" or "ready recollection." Third, there is unfamiliar or technical vocabulary, such as hermeneutics, exegesis, eisegesis, legalism, propitiation, justification, Christocentric, missional, Torah, etc. It's important for us to define or clarify what we mean by these words or use different words altogether. Fourth, there are designations or acronyms that churches use for events or names for groups that those on the outside might find inscrutable. For instance, some churches have what they call a Taft and Eisenhower group for those born during the presidencies of those two men. We use the following acronyms: F.E.A.S.T. (Feeding Everyone and Studying Together), LBC (Ladies Bible Class), L2L (Lads to Leaders), and PSYG (Pulaski Street Youth Group).

We need to be sensitive to the fact that our vocabulary can sometimes make others feel even more like an outsider. I think about the situation that existed in the church at Corinth (and presumably other churches) in the first century: "If, therefore, the whole church comes together and all speak in tongues [i.e., foreign languages they've never studied], and outsiders or unbelievers enter, will they not say that you are out of your minds?" (1 Cor. 14:23, clarification added). Later Paul says, "If any speak in a tongue, let there be only two or at most three, and each in turn, and let someone interpret" (vs. 27). There is a call for intelligibility here, and that's a principle we must keep in mind today. While we don't speak in tongues today (1 Cor. 13:8-10), we do say things that many outsiders and visitors may find strange. Let's pay attention to our lingo and be sensitive to what needs to be defined or clarified. Jacob Evans
