Irreplaceable

Tofu, Splenda, Mountain Lightning, Impossible Whopper, and zoodles. What do these things have in common? Well, besides being things that people ingest, they all serve as substitutes for the real thing. [By the way, a "zoodle" is a zucchini noodle.] Most substitutes are advertised as "just the same" or "as good as the original," but I've yet to meet anybody who would choose a Mountain Lightning over a Mountain Dew. About the only substitute that most people prefer is a substitute teacher, though the folks in those Burger King commercials claim they can't tell the difference between the Impossible Whopper and a real Whopper. I'll just have to remain skeptical. I don't plan to do my own taste test.

Substitutes or replacements are everywhere, even when it comes to God. While most substitute choices we make are inconsequential, substituting something or someone in the place of God is both foolish and dangerous. Some of the most common God-substitutes here in the West are money, career, politics, sports, and health/beauty. None of these things is inherently wrong, but the day you replace God on the throne of your heart with one of these things, looking to it for ultimate fulfillment, identity, and security, is the day you become guilty of idolatry (cf. Matt. 6:24; Col. 3:5).

The testimony of Scripture is that God is irreplaceable. Jeremiah exclaims, "There is none like you, O LORD; you are great, and your name is great in might. Who would not fear you, O King of the nations? For this is your due; for among all the wise ones of the nations and in all their kingdoms there is none like you" (Jer. 10:6-7). No one or nothing can deliver like God delivers. No one or nothing can offer what God offers. No one or nothing can promise what God promises. What sense does it make to attempt to replace the irreplaceable? No one or nothing deserves to sit on the throne of our hearts, except God.
