White Like Snow

Job views God as sovereign over the snow (37:22), and God questions Job about whether he has found a way to enter His "storehouses of snow" (38:22). These two thoughts juxtaposed together bring a smile to my face. Though advances in meteorology since the time of Job have attempted to lessen the wonder of wintry weather, I like picturing God among His storehouses of snow, choosing when and where to send snow to the earth.

Over the past week, to use the words of the Psalmist, God has "hurl[ed] down his crystals of ice like crumbs" (Ps. 147:17). On Monday, I opened the front door of my house on several occasions just to listen to the clicking and clacking of those little beads of ice. My children and I involuntarily reached out our hands to catch a few ice crumbs. Before evaporating in our hands, they were cold and white . . . real white.

Though winter storms create treacherous road conditions and skittish drivers, especially here in the South, they do have a way of transforming the landscape in remarkable ways. What once looked gloomy is now luminous. What once looked shabby is now beautiful. What once looked dingy and dirty is now clean.

In Scripture, the Holy Spirit is fond of using this purifying and cleansing effect of snow to help readers picture the dramatic effect that God's forgiveness of sin has upon a sinner. In reflecting on his sin with Bathsheba, David pleads with God: "Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow" (Ps. 51:7). In calling an estranged Israel back to Himself, God says, "Come now, let us reason together, says the LORD: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool" (Isa. 1:18).

Sin darkens and contaminates our souls; God's forgiveness of our sins brightens and purifies our souls, enabling us to reflect the radiant holiness of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ (Dan. 7:9; Matt. 28:3; Rev. 1:14). If you desire a soul that is white like the snow or ice that has fallen this past week, Jesus has made that possible, and I can help you get to know Him.




"GOD and SCIENCE" SEMINAR for Hispanic families
