The Prince of Peace on Peace

In Matthew 6:24-34, Jesus, the Prince of Peace, tells us how we can have peace. As we'll see, Jesus didn't just explain how to have peace; He also embodied these peace principles.

First, like Jesus, we must be **consecrated**. It's impossible to serve two masters, so we shouldn't even try (Matt. 6:24). We must make God our one and only. Jesus displayed devotion to the Father despite temptation (Matt. 4:1-11; Heb. 4:15) or pressure to do otherwise (Matt. 26:36-46). It should be no different with us (1 Cor. 10:13; Rev. 2:10b). How much peace do we sacrifice attempting to live with one foot in the kingdom of God and one foot in the world?

Second, like Jesus, we must be **convinced**. Jesus understood that human beings are invaluable in God's eyes, outstripping the birds God feeds (Matt. 6:25-26) and the flowers God clothes (Matt. 6:28-30). God knows what we need (Matt. 6:31-32), and if He provides the less-valuable birds and flowers with what they need, He will most assuredly provide us with what we need. Jesus also understood that worry never changes things for the better (Matt. 6:27). Worry can't add an hour to our life or a cubit to our height. How much peace do we sacrifice worrying about things that God has already promised to provide?

Third, like Jesus, we must be **committed**. In Matthew 6:33, Jesus says, "But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." Jesus gave priority to His Father's kingdom. Giving priority to the kingdom of God entails selflessness (Luke 9:23-27; Phil. 2:3-11) and involves bringing glory to God (Isa. 43:7; John 17:4; 1 Cor. 6:19-20; 10:31). In giving priority to God's kingdom, we ensure that God will provide us with what we need. How much peace do we sacrifice chasing after what we want rather than what God wants?

If you want to stop sacrificing so much peace in your life, then listen to and observe the Prince of Peace.
